Advanced Air Mobility Study Task Force. -19 The Advanced Air Mobility Study Task Force, a task 20 force as defined in s. 20.03(8), Florida Statutes, is created 21 adjunct to the Department of Transportation. The task force is 22 composed of the following members:

- (2) Appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority.
- (3) Task force members shall serve without compensation but are entitled to receive reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (4) The task force shall hold public hearings in locations throughout this state, or by electronic means, and receive public comments through a website or by mail. The task force shall:
- (a) Assess and describe the current state of development of the advanced air mobility industry, specifically, deployment of VTOL aircraft. As used in this section, the term "VTOL aircraft" means aircraft capable of taking off and landing vertically without use of a runway.
- (b) Identify and discuss any federal requirements that must be met for deployment of advanced air mobility in this state.
- (c) Recommend any revisions to current state law that may impact the advanced air mobility industry, including, but not limited to, any revisions that would create jurisdictional consistency for advanced air mobility operations throughout this

77	(d) Collaborate with local governments to evaluate
78	potential integration of advanced air mobility into
79	transportation plans. Such collaboration shall be summarized in

81	(5) By October 1, 2023, the task force shall submit to the
