24	(a) The disabled parking permit is a placard that can be

27 <u>1.</u> Each side of the placard must <u>display</u> have the
28 international symbol of accessibility in a contrasting color in
29 the center so as to be visible.

2. One side of the placard must display:

31 <u>a.</u> The applicant's driver license number or state 32 identification card number along with a warning that the 33 applicant must have such identification at all times while using 34 the parking permit.

35 <u>b.</u> For a parking permit issued on or after July 1, 2018, a 36 <u>copy of the applicant's photograph that appears on his or her</u> 37 <u>driver license or identification card. The photograph must be</u> 38 <u>concealed by a movable flap or cover in order to protect the</u> 39 <u>identity of the applicant while the placard is displayed in the</u> 40 <u>vehicle.</u>

3. In those cases where the severity of the disability 41 42 prevents a disabled person from physically visiting or being 43 transported to a driver license or tax collector office to 44 obtain a driver license or identification card, a certifying 45 physician may sign the exemption section of the department's 46 parking permit application to exempt the disabled person from being issued a driver license or identification card for the 47 48 number and photograph to be displayed on the parking permit.

49 <u>4.</u> A validation sticker must also be issued with each
50 disabled parking permit, showing the month and year of

51 expiration on each side of the placard. Validation stickers must 52 be of the size specified by the Department of Highway Safety and 53 Motor Vehicles and must be affixed to the disabled parking 54 permits. The disabled parking permits must use the same colors 55 as license plate validations.

(3) DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; TEMPORARY.-

57 (a) The temporary disabled parking permit is a placard of 58 a different color from the color of the long-term disabled parking permit placard, and must clearly display the date of 59 expiration in large print and with color coding, but is 60 identical to the long-term disabled parking permit placard in 61 62 all other respects, including, but not limited to, the inclusion of a state identification card number or driver license number 63 64 and photograph on one side of the temporary permit. The 65 temporary disabled parking permit placard must be designed to 66 conspicuously display the expiration date of the permit on the 67 front and back of the placard.
