- (b) Certified school counselors shall give the advice required by this subsection at least once per academic year before public high school students select courses for the subsequent academic year. The advice must include the following information:
- 1. Apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs offered pursuant to chapter 446.
- 2. Dual enrollment programs offered pursuant to s. 1007.271.
- 3. Career and professional academies and career-themed courses available pursuant to s. 1003.493.
- $\underline{\text{4. Opportunities at local school district technical}}$ centers.
 - 5. Opportunities to gain an internship.
- 6. The Career and Technical Education pathway to earn a standard high school diploma pursuant to s. 1003.4282(11) and all opportunities to earn credits toward the pathway.
- (c) If an insufficient number of certified school
 counselors is available to give the advice required by this
 subsection, then the staff of other student personnel services

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as defined in s. 1012.01(2)(b) may give the advice.

- (d) A student with limited English proficiency, as defined in s. 1003.56, must be provided the advice required under this subsection in his or her native language. Such advice may be provided in person or by video conference, telephone, or in print.
- (2) Each district school board shall annually submit a district guidance report to the Commissioner of Education by June 30.
- $\underline{(3)}$ (2) The guidance report shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- (a) Examination of student access to certified school counselors.
- (b) Degree to which a district has adopted or implemented a quidance model program.
- (c) Evaluation of the information and training available to certified school counselors and career specialists to advise students on areas of critical need, labor market trends, and technical training requirements.
- (d) Progress toward incorporation of best practices for advisement as identified by the department.
- (e) Consideration of alternative guidance systems or ideas, including, but not limited to, a teacher-advisor model, mentoring, partnerships with the business community, web-based delivery, and parental involvement.

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(f) A guidance plan for the district.

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(4)(3) The department shall provide resources to district school boards that may assist districts in offering the advice required by subsection (1) and preparing the annual guidance report. The resources shall include, but are not limited to, materials relating to guidance model programs, training available through the department for career guidance, adopted best practices, alternative guidance systems or ideas, and a model district guidance plan.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
