46	(2) PROGRAM CREATION.—The Veterinary Care for Retired								
47	Military Working Dogs Program is created within the department								
48	to provide a stable funding source for veterinary care provided								
49	to retired military working dogs.								
50	(3) ADMINISTRATION.—The department shall contract with a								

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corporation not for profit organized under chapter 617 to administer and manage the Veterinary Care for Retired Military Working Dogs Program. Notwithstanding chapter 287, the department shall select the corporation not for profit through a competitive grant award process. The corporation not for profit must:

- (a) Be dedicated to the protection or care of retired military working dogs.
- (b) Be exempt from taxation under s. 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in s. 501(c)(3) of that code and have maintained such tax-exempt status for at least 5 years.
- (c) Agree to be subject to review and audit at the discretion of the Auditor General in order to ensure accurate accounting and disbursement of state funds.
- (d) Demonstrate the ability to effectively and efficiently disseminate information and to assist adopters of retired military working dogs in complying with this section.
 - (4) FUNDING.-

(a) The corporation not for profit shall be the disbursing authority for funds appropriated by the Legislature to the department for the Veterinary Care for Retired Military Working Dogs Program. These funds shall be disbursed to the adopter of a retired military working dog to reimburse him or her for the cost of veterinary care provided to the dog upon receipt of:

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1. Valid documentation from the branch of the United

States Armed Forces from which the dog retired which verifies
the dog's service; and

- 2. A valid invoice from a veterinarian for veterinary care provided in this state to a retired military working dog and documentation establishing payment of the invoice by the adopter of the dog.
- (b) Disbursements to an adopter of a retired military working dog may not exceed \$10,000 per dog over the dog's lifetime.
- (c) An adopter of a retired military working dog who seeks reimbursement for veterinary care may not receive reimbursement if funds appropriated for the Veterinary Care for Retired Military Working Dogs Program are depleted in the year in which the reimbursement is sought.
- (5) ADMINISTRATIVE FEES.—The department shall pay to the corporation not for profit, and the corporation not for profit may use, up to 10 percent of appropriated funds for its administrative expenses, including salaries and benefits.
- (6) RULEMAKING.—The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.
- Section 2. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year and each fiscal year thereafter, the sum of \$300,000 in recurring funds is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Veterans' Affairs for the purpose of implementing and
