25	whether the patient has medical insurance or the ability to pay
26	for the service, and

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27 WHEREAS, emergency medical air transportation services 28 providers are not eligible to apply for additional federal 29 funding for providing services to high numbers of Medicaid, 30 uninsured, or underinsured patients pursuant to Florida's 31 Medicaid program, and

32 WHEREAS, emergency medical air transportation services 33 providers provide coverage to multiple counties within a 100-34 mile radius of their bases, and often their transports originate 35 in a county other than where the provider is based, which makes 36 it difficult for the provider to be locally funded except in the 37 largest of counties, and

38 WHEREAS, the Florida Medicaid program reimburses emergency 39 medical air transportation services providers far below what it 40 costs the providers to provide emergency air transportation and 41 pays nothing if the patient is indigent and not eligible for 42 Medicaid, and

WHEREAS, fines and penalties for traffic violations discourage dangerous driving behavior and, for certain traffic violations, a portion of the penalty is used to fund programs that provide health care and rehabilitation to victims of dangerous drivers, and

WHEREAS, an additional penalty for each moving traffic violation will provide support for emergency medical air transportation services, which are the most critical services for persons injured as a result of a traffic collision, and WHEREAS, emergency medical air transportation services play

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53 a key role in the statewide emergency medical services system, including disaster response and homeland security, and, 54 55 therefore, it is important for the state to support these vital services, NOW, THEREFORE, 56 57 58 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 59 Section 1. Section 401.2515, Florida Statutes, is created 60 61 to read: 62 401.2515 Emergency medical air transportation services.-(1) 63 This section may be cited as the "Emergency Medical 64 Air Transportation Act." 65 (2) As used in this section, the term: 66 (a) "Air mileage rate" means the per-mile reimbursement 67 rate paid for services rendered by rotary-wing and fixed-wing 68 providers. 81	(3) The department shall establish, as a part of the
82	Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund, a separate account, in an
83	amount determined by the Legislature, to be known as the
84	"Emergency Medical Air Transportation Act Account." The
85	Emergency Medical Air Transportation Act Account shall be used
86	to augment reimbursement payments for emergency medical air
87	transportation services made under the Florida Medicaid program.
88	(4) In cooperation with the Agency for Health Care
89	Administration, the department shall use the moneys in the
