Program.—The Legislature recognizes that Florida's teacher shortage is a critical issue within this state. In an effort to recruit and retain Florida's best, the Classroom Teacher Student Loan Forgiveness Program shall encourage qualified individuals to seek employment in public schools with critical staffing needs as identified by high teacher turnover rates.

- (1) There is established the Classroom Teacher Student
 Loan Forgiveness Program to be administered by the Department of
 Education to increase the employment and retention of classroom
 teachers in a public school with at least a 50-percent year-toyear teacher turnover rate, as determined by comparing the
 teacher roster at the end of the previous school year to the
 teacher roster of the October student membership survey of the
 current year.
 - (2) To be eligible for the program, an individual:
 - (a) Must be a resident of the state.

- (b) Must have graduated from a postsecondary educational institution in the state with a bachelor's degree or higher in education.
- (c) Must be a classroom teacher, as defined in s.

 1012.01(2)(a), who will teach at a public school with at least a

 50-percent year-to-year teacher turnover rate.
- (d) Must be enrolled in a federal income-based student loan repayment program.

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(3) An individual who meets the requirements of subsection
(2) may apply to the department for acceptance into the program.
Individuals shall be accepted on a first-come, first-served
basis. Upon acceptance into the program, and from the funds
appropriated for the program, the department shall make payments
in equal monthly installments to the holder of the individual's
student loan in a minimum amount of \$4,000 total per year for a
period of 5 years and send receipt of such payment to the
program participant. The state is not responsible for the
collection of any interest charges or other remaining balances.
An individual maintains his or her eligibility for the program
as long as he or she continues to teach at the public school
where he or she taught when accepted into the program or at
another public school with at least a 50-percent year-to-year
teacher turnover rate.

- (4) Only loans that are not in default and issued pursuant to the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, to pay the costs of a postsecondary education shall be covered under the program.
- (5) A payment under this section is not taxable income and shall be made directly to the holder of the individual's student loan.
- (6) The Legislature shall appropriate funds for the administration of the program.
 - (7) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to
