The release of such information about a 111 pending investigation or examination of violations of s. 112 319.1414, s. 319.25, chapter 320, and chapter 322, Florida 113 Statutes, could obstruct or jeopardize the integrity of the 114 investigation or examination and impair the ability of the 115 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the 116 performance of its official duties and responsibilities under s. 117 319.1414, s. 319.25, chapter 320, and chapter 322, Florida 118 Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature finds that it is a public 119 necessity to make such information confidential and exempt from 120 public records requirements. Section 6. This act shall take effect on the same date 121 122 that CS/HB 1151 or similar legislation takes effect, if such 123 legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an 124 extension thereof and becomes a law.

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
