Therefore, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to make such information confidential and exempt from public records requirements. Section 6. This act shall take effect on the same date that CS/HB 1151 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.

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
