12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

14	Section 1. (1) The Legislature recognizes the vast
15	devastation and destruction that transformed and impacted homes,
16	families, businesses, and commerce in Puerto Rico as a result of
17	the hurricanes that swept through the Caribbean during 2017;
18	that the citizens and businesses of Puerto Rico may not be able
19	to fully rebuild the island for years to come; and that, given
20	the dire financial problems plaguing the citizens of Puerto
21	Rico, many families have become economically distressed and can
22	no longer work in a stable and predictable way. The Legislature
23	also recognizes that many of these citizens, by necessity, have
24	evacuated their homes and migrated to Florida to find gainful
25	employment. To that end, the Legislature determines that it is

26	in the best interest of the state to provide a legal path to
27	grant certain professionals from Puerto Rico an opportunity to
28	receive a temporary license or certificate in this state so they
29	may become employed.
30	(2) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, professionals
31	from each of the following licensed or certified professions who
32	evacuated from Puerto Rico during the 2017 calendar year may
33	receive a 2-year temporary license or certificate:
34	(a) Barbers licensed under chapter 476.
35	(b) Clinical social workers licensed under chapter 491.
36	(c) Cosmetologists licensed under chapter 477.
37	(d) Engineers licensed under chapter 471.
38	(e) Mental health counselors licensed under chapter 491.
39	(f) Teachers certified under rules of the State Board of
40	Education.
41	(3) To be eligible to receive a temporary license or
42	certificate under subsection (2), the professional must provide
43	the applicable licensing entity or the State Board of Education
44	with documentation of his or her license or certificate in
45	Puerto Rico in the respective field. The temporary license or
46	certificate shall expire 2 years after issuance and is
47	nonrenewable.
48	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
