The department may 19 certified copy of an original nonviable birth 20 certificate which includes the confidential and exempt 21 information: 22 1. To the fetus' parent; 23 2. To any local, state, or federal agency for official 24 purposes upon approval by the department; or 25 3. Upon the order of any court of competent jurisdiction.

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(b) All information relating to the cause of death and parentage of a nonviable fetus, the marital status of such fetus' parent, and any medical information included in nonviable birth records held by a state agency is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, but may be released for health research purposes as approved by the department.

- (c)  $\underline{1}$ . The department shall authorize the issuance of a certified copy of all or part of an original nonviable birth certificate, excluding any information that is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, to any person requesting such copy, pursuant to paragraph (b), upon receipt of a request and payment of the fee prescribed in s. 382.0255.
- 2. The department may issue a certified copy of an original nonviable birth certificate which includes the confidential and exempt information:
  - a. To the fetus' parent;

- b. To any local, state, or federal agency for official purposes upon approval by the department; or
  - c. Upon the order of any court of competent jurisdiction.
- (d) This subsection is subject to the Open Government

  Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand

  repealed on October 2, 2022, unless reviewed and saved from

  repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2022.

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
