Paragraph (o) is added to subsection (2) of 16 section 119.071, Florida Statutes, to read: 17 119.071 General exemptions from inspection or copying of 18 public records.-19 (2) AGENCY INVESTIGATIONS. -20 The address of a victim of an incident of mass 21 violence is exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the 22 State Constitution. For purposes of this paragraph, the term "incident of mass violence" means an incident in which four or 23 more people, not including the perpetrator, are severely injured 24

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or killed by an intentional and indiscriminate act of violence

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26	of another. For purposes of this paragraph, the term "victim"
27	means a person killed or injured during an incident of mass
28	violence, not including the perpetrator. This paragraph is
29	subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance

33	Section 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of section
34	119.011, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

37	(c) "Criminal intelligence information" and "criminal

39	1. The time, date, location, and nature of a reported

41	2. The name, sex, age, and address of a person arrested or

44	3. The time, date, and location of the incident and of the

Section 3. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that the address of victims of an incident of mass violence be made exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. After an incident of mass violence has occurred, victims of such an incident are in a vulnerable state as they assist law enforcement with the investigation of the incident and try to recover from the events that occurred. In some instances, the victim may have been killed or injured leaving their families to deal with the aftermath of the crime. The public availability of such victim's address may be used to locate the victim or the victim's family. The availability of such information has allowed people to take advantage of the victims or their families by subjecting the victims or their families to media intrusions at their homes and other unwelcome intrusions into their privacy. Therefore, it is

necessary that the address of victims of incidents of mass
violence be protected to ensure that persons affected by such
incidents are not harassed, taken advantage of, or otherwise
subjected to additional pain and suffering.
Section 4 This act shall take effect upon becoming a law

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
