> WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the seventh leading cause of death in the United States, killing more people than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined, and

WHEREAS, in 2022, an estimated 6.5 million of those living with Alzheimer's disease were 65 years of age or older, and an estimated 200,000 individuals were under age 65 and living with

11 younger-onset Alzheimer's, and

> WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association reports that Florida has the second-highest prevalence rate of Alzheimer's disease in the nation, with more than 580,000 Floridians living with the disease, and that number is expected to rise to 720,000 by 2025, and

WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association projects that, in the absence of the development of medical interventions to prevent or cure the disease, the number of Americans living with Alzheimer's disease will nearly double by 2050, and

WHEREAS, in 2021, caregivers, including family members and friends, for individuals living with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia collectively provided 16 billion hours of unpaid care to such persons at an estimated cost of \$272 billion, and
