

Senators Beach of the 21st and Ginn of the 47th offered the following amendment #2:

1 *Amend the substitute to HB 1073 (LC 47 3013S) on line 1 by inserting following "To" the*  
2 *following:*

3 amend Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to regulation  
4 of alcoholic beverages generally, so as to provide for Sunday sales of alcoholic beverages  
5 for consumption on the premises in locally designated special entertainment districts; to  
6 provide for a definition;

7 *By inserting "to provide an effective date;" on line 5 following "matters;"*

8 *By inserting after line 8 the following:*

9 Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to regulation of  
10 alcoholic beverages generally, is amended in Code Section 3-3-7, relating to local  
11 authorization and regulation of sales of alcoholic beverages on Sunday, by adding a new  
12 subsection to read as follows:

13 "(s)(1) As used in this subsection, the term 'special entertainment district' means  
14 contiguous properties upon which is located a festival marketplace and entertainment  
15 project which receives or has received financing in whole or in part by public funds and  
16 which contains a minimum of 200,000 square feet of gross leasable space for retail sales  
17 and entertainment purposes and which is located in the central business district of a  
18 municipality if more than 50 percent of such contiguous properties are owned or  
19 controlled by a governmental entity.

20 (2) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, a municipality may, by resolution or  
21 ordinance, authorize in any locally designated special entertainment district the sale of  
22 alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises:

23 (A) On Saturdays from 11:55 P.M. and the three hours immediately following such  
24 time; and

25 (B) On Sundays from 11:00 A.M. until 12:00 Midnight."

26 **SECTION 2.**

27 *By replacing line 141 with the following:*

28 **SECTION 3.**

29 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
30 without such approval.
