SECTION 5A.

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 21-2-385.1, relating to preferential
 treatment for older and disabled voters, as follows:

13 During the period of advance voting established pursuant to subsection (d) of Code 14 Section 21-2-385, each elector who is 75 65 years of age or older, who is pregnant, who 15 is accompanied by one or more children of five years of age or under, who is accompanied 16 by one or more children with special needs regardless of the age of such child, or who is 17 disabled and requires assistance in casting an absentee ballot in person at the registrar's 18 office, absentee ballot clerk's office, or other locations as provided for in Code 19 Section 21-2-382, shall, upon request to a designated office employee or other individual, 20 be authorized to vote immediately at the next available voting compartment or booth 21 without having to wait in line if such location utilizes direct recording electronic voting

- systems or be authorized to go to the head of any line necessary to cast a written absentee
 ballot. Notice of the provisions of this Code section shall be prominently displayed in the
 registrar's office or absentee ballot clerk's office."

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 21-2-409.1, relating to voting by
electors who are 75 years of age or older or disabled electors without having to wait in line,
as follows:

30 On election day between the hours of 9:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M., each elector who is 75 65 31 years of age or older, who is pregnant, who is accompanied by one or more children of five 32 years of age or under, who is accompanied by one or more children with special needs 33 regardless of the age of such child, or who is disabled and requires assistance in voting as 34 authorized by Code Section 21-2-409, shall, upon request to a poll officer, be authorized 35 at any primary or election to vote immediately at the next available voting compartment or booth without having to wait in line. Notice of the provisions of this Code section shall 36 37 be prominently displayed in the voting place."
