A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 48-9-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to levy of excise tax, rate, taxation of motor fuels not commonly sold or measured by gallon, rate, prohibition of tax on motor fuel by political subdivisions, exception, and exempted sales, so as to provide for exemption from certain excise taxes on motor fuel and compressed natural gas for public mass transit vehicles owned by public transportation systems, certain vehicles owned by public campus transportation systems, and school buses operated by public school systems; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
- 9 SECTION 1.
 10 Code Section 48-9-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to levy of excise
 11 tax, rate, taxation of motor fuels not commonly sold or measured by gallon, rate, prohibition
 12 of tax on motor fuel by political subdivisions, exception, and exempted sales, is amended by
 13 revising paragraphs (10) and (11) of subsection (b) as follows:
 14 "(10)(A) During the period of July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2015 On and after July 1,
- 2021, sales of motor fuel, as defined in paragraph (9) of Code Section 48-9-2, and
 compressed natural gas, as defined in paragraph (4) of subsection (a) of this Code

section, for use in public mass transit vehicles which are owned by public transportation
 systems which receive or are eligible to receive funds pursuant to 49 U.S.C. Sections
 5307 and 5311 for which passenger fares are routinely charged and which vehicles are
 used exclusively for revenue generating purposes and which motor fuel sales occur at
 bulk purchase facilities approved by the department.

22 (B) During the period of July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2015 On and after July 1, 2021, 23 sales of motor fuel, as defined in paragraph (9) of Code Section 48-9-2, and compressed 24 natural gas, as defined in paragraph (4) of subsection (a) of this Code section, for use 25 in vehicles operated owned by a public campus transportation system, provided that 26 such system has a policy which provides for free transfer of passengers from the public 27 transportation system operated by the jurisdiction in which the campus is located; makes the general public aware of such free transfer policy; and receives no state or 28 29 federal funding to assist in the operation of such public campus transportation system 30 and which motor fuel sales occur at bulk purchase facilities approved by the 31 department.

32 (C) For purposes of this paragraph, the term 'vehicle' or 'vehicles' means buses, vans,
 33 minibuses, or other vehicles which have the capacity to transport seven or more
 34 passengers; or

(11) For the period of time beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015 On and
after July 1, 2021, sales of motor fuel, as defined in paragraph (9) of Code Section
48-9-2, and compressed natural gas, as defined in paragraph (4) of subsection (a) of this
Code section, to public school systems in this state for the exclusive use of the school
system in operating school buses when the motor fuel is purchased and paid for by the
school system."
