A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 physicians, assistants, and others, so as to provide for suspension or revocation of the license
- 3 of a physician who has committed a sexual assault on a patient; to provide for mandatory
- 4 reporting by health care professionals who have reasonable cause to believe that a physician
- 5 has committed a sexual assault on a patient; to provide for limited liability; to provide for
- 6 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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X	SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to physicians,
- assistants, and others, is amended by adding a new subsection to Code Section 43-34-8,
- 11 relating to the authority of the Georgia Composite Medical Board to refuse license,
- 12 certificate, or permit or issue discipline, to read as follows:
- 13 "(b.2) The board shall suspend or revoke the license of a physician who:
- 14 (1) The board has found, after conducting an investigation, to have committed a sexual
- 15 <u>assault on a patient;</u>
- 16 (2) Has pleaded guilty to committing a sexual assault on a patient; or
- 17 (3) Has been found guilty by a court of law of committing a sexual assault on a patient."

18 SECTION 2.

- 19 Said chapter is further amended in Article 2, relating to medical practice, by adding a new
- 20 Code section to read as follows:
- 21 "43-34-47.
- 22 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 23 (1) 'Health care professional' means:
- 24 (A) A physician licensed to practice medicine under this chapter;
- 25 (B) A registered nurse or a practical nurse licensed under Chapter 26 of this title; or

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- 27 (2) 'Sexual assault' shall have the same meaning as in Code Section 15-24-1.
- 28 (b) A health care professional shall report the name of a physician to the board if the health
- 29 <u>care professional has reasonable cause to believe that such physician has committed sexual</u>
- 30 <u>assault on a patient. A health care professional shall not be required to duplicate a report</u>
- 31 <u>if he or she has reasonable cause to believe that such report has been made to the board.</u>
- 32 A health care professional shall not be required to report a physician to the board under this
- 33 <u>Code section as a result of professional knowledge obtained in the course of the health care</u>
- 34 <u>professional-patient relationship when the physician is the patient.</u>
- 35 (c) No health care professional required to report a physician to the board under this Code
- 36 section who in good faith either reports or fails to report shall be subject to civil or criminal
- 37 <u>liability or discipline for unprofessional conduct for such action or inaction."</u>

38 SECTION 3.

39 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
