The House Committee on Insurance offers the following substitute to HB 1005:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 insurance generally, so as to require that every health benefit policy shall provide coverage
- 3 for rabies immune globulin and vaccinations administered after potential exposure to rabies;
- 4 to provide for definitions; to provide for applicability; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 8 Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to insurance
- 9 generally, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

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- 11 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 12 (1) 'Health benefit policy' means any individual or group plan, policy, or contract for
- healthcare services issued, delivered, issued for delivery, executed, or renewed by an
- insurer in this state, including, but not limited to, those contracts executed by the
- Department of Community Health pursuant to paragraph (1) of subsection (d) of Code
- Section 31-2-4. Such term shall not include the following limited benefit insurance

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17 policies: accident only, TRICARE supplement, dental, disability income, fixed indemnity, long-term care, Medicare supplement, specified disease, vision, and 18 nonrenewable individual policies written for a period of less than 12 months, or any 19 20 policy subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, 29 U.S.C. Section 1001, et seq. 21 22 (2) 'Insurer' means an accident and sickness insurer, fraternal benefit society, healthcare 23 corporation, health maintenance organization, preferred provider organization, provider 24 sponsored healthcare corporation, managed care entity, or any similar entity authorized to issue contracts under this title or to provide health benefit policies. 25 (3) 'Rabies immune globulin' means a medication that is taken in conjunction with the 26 27 rabies vaccine to provide immediate protection against rabies while the body's immune system responds to the rabies vaccine. 28 (b) A health benefit policy that is delivered, issued, issued for delivery, executed, or 29 30 renewed in this state or approved for issuance or renewal in this state by the Commissioner shall provide coverage for rabies immune globulin and the rabies vaccine administered 31 32 after potential exposure to rabies. 33 (c) The benefits provided for in subsection (b) of this Code section shall be subject to the 34 same annual deductibles or coinsurance established by an insurer for all other covered 35 benefits within a given health benefit policy. (d) This Code section shall apply to all policies, contracts, and certificates delivered. 36
