The Senate Committee on Economic Development and Tourism offered the following substitute to HB 1034:

- 13 The General Assembly finds that:
- 14 (1) Making sugarcane syrup has been a part of family farm tradition for generations,15 particularly in Georgia;

16 (2) The increase in production costs, competition from artificial syrups, and the 17 decreasing number of farmers who still make sugarcane syrup, however, has led some to 18 refer to the making of sugarcane syrup as a dying art;

(3) Establishing a "National Sugarcane Syrup Day" in Georgia would help to preserve
the art of making sugarcane syrup by honoring those who continue with this longstanding
family farm tradition and by raising public awareness of the differences between natural
sugarcane syrup and artificial syrups;

23 (4) Designating the fourth Friday in November of each year, the day after Thanksgiving,

24 as "National Sugarcane Syrup Day" is particularly fitting, as it is not only a time when

25 families gather and celebrate together, but is also a time when some say sugarcane is at

26 its sweetest in Georgia; and

27 (5) It is, therefore, abundantly fitting and proper that the State of Georgia appropriately

recognize and honor the family farm tradition of making sugarcane syrup by designating

the fourth Friday in November of each year as "National Sugarcane Syrup Day" inGeorgia.

# PART II

### **SECTION 2-1.**

39 Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state flag, seal,40 and other symbols, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

## "ARTICLE 8

42 <u>50-3-130.</u>

43 (a) There shall be placed upon the grounds of the state capitol building and upon the grounds outside the state archives building a marker which commemorates the patriots of 44 45 the Revolutionary War, honoring the men and women who helped America achieve independence. Each such marker shall honor the two-hundred and fiftieth anniversary of 46 47 the United States and those who fought for the noble cause of liberty and for a new nation. 48 (b) Placement location for Revolutionary War Patriots markers provided for in this Code 49 section shall be subject to approval by the Capitol Art Standards Commission for 50 placement upon the grounds of the state capitol building and by the Board of Regents of 51 the University System of Georgia for the placement of the marker upon the grounds outside 52 the state archives building. 53 (c) No public funds shall be expended for the design or procurement of the markers 54 provided for in this Code section. Each such marker shall be placed as soon as practicable." 55 PART III
