A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 2A of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department of Public Health, so as to create the Georgia Commission on Maternal and Infant Health; to provide for its composition, membership, duties, and responsibilities; to provide for a definition; to provide for funding; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.** 8 Chapter 2A of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department 9 of Public Health, is amended in Article 1, relating to general provisions, by revising Code 10 Section 31-2A-12, which is reserved, as follows: "31-2A-12. 11 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'perinatal care' means maternal and infant health 13 improvement services and ancillary services that are appropriate for women and infants 14 during the perinatal period, which begins before conception and ends on the infant's first 15 birthday.

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16	(b) There is created the Georgia Commission on Maternal and Infant Health to be assigned
17	to the Department of Public Health for administrative purposes only as prescribed in Code
18	Section 50-4-3. The commission shall consist of 14 members, who shall be appointed as
19	<u>follows:</u>
20	(1) Six members shall be appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall include among
21	his or her appointees an obstetrician, either a pediatrician or neonatologist, a midwife, and
22	a representative of a perinatal facility;
23	(2) Three members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; and
24	(3) Three members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
25	The commissioner or his or her designee and the chief executive officer of the Georgia
26	Research Alliance or his or her designee shall serve as members of the commission. The
27	Governor shall appoint one member to serve as the chairperson of the commission.
28	(c) Members of the commission shall receive no compensation for their services but shall
29	be allowed actual and necessary expenses in the performance of their duties. Any
30	legislative members of the council shall receive the allowances provided for in Code
31	Section 28-1-8. Citizen members shall be entitled to receive reimbursement for per diem
32	and travel expenses as provided in Code Section 45-7-21.
33	(d) The commission shall meet at least four times per year at the call of the chairperson or
34	upon the request of at least seven of its members.
35	(e) The commission shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
36	(1) To solicit the views of perinatal facilities, healthcare providers, and related
37	professional associations on the state of perinatal care in Georgia and give due
38	consideration to the current recommendations of medical and scientific organizations in
39	the field of perinatal care;
40	(2) To make policy recommendations regarding programs of perinatal care with local
41	communities, their physicians and perinatal facilities, and the general public:

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42	(3) To establish indices to measure the quality and determine the effectiveness of
43	perinatal care in Georgia;
44	(4) To make available to the public the records of all meetings of the commission and
45	all business transacted by the commission;
46	(5) To employ such staff and to enter into such contracts as may be necessary to fulfill
47	its duties and responsibilities under this chapter subject to funding by the General
48	Assembly;
49	(6) To consult with and advise the department on matters related to the establishment,
50	maintenance, operation, and outcomes evaluation of perinatal care initiatives in this state;
51	and
52	(7) To make state-wide policy recommendations based on its findings.
53	(f) The commission may request additional funding from any additional source including,
54	but not limited to, federal and private grants.
55	(g) No later than June 30, 2026, the commission shall submit a detailed written report on
56	its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly.
57	(h) This Code section shall stand automatically repealed on July 1, 2026. Reserved."

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SECTION 2.

59 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
