A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, the 1 2 "Quality Basic Education Act," so as to provide for trauma informed school counselors in 3 Georgia's public schools; to provide for the repeal of provisions for state funding for school 4 counselors; to provide for state funding for one trauma informed school counselor for every 5 150 full-time equivalent students; to provide for duties and responsibilities of trauma 6 informed school counselors; to require the Professional Standards Commission to create a 7 professional trauma informed school counselor endorsement for eligible certificated 8 professional personnel; to provide for eligibility of individuals to receive such endorsement; 9 to provide for eligibility for professional trauma informed school counselor programs; to 10 provide for assessing the fidelity of training and implementation for individuals who receive 11 such endorsement; to provide for related matters; to provide for a short title; to provide for 12 an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

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15 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Trauma Informed School Counselors Act."

16 SECTION 2.

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17 Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, the "Quality Basic Education Act," is amended in Part 5, relating to program weights and funding 18 19 requirements, by revising subsection (c) and adding a new subsection to Code Section 20-2-182, relating to program weights to reflect funds for payment of salaries and benefits, 20 21 maximum class size, reporting requirements, and application to specific school years, to read 22 as follows: 23 "(c) The program weights for the kindergarten, kindergarten early intervention, primary, 24 primary grades early intervention, upper elementary, upper elementary grades early 25 intervention, middle school, and alternative education programs and the program weights 26 for the high school programs authorized pursuant to paragraph (4) of subsection (b) of 27 Code Section 20-2-151, when multiplied by the base amount, shall reflect sufficient funds 28 to pay the beginning salaries for at least one school counselor for every 450 full-time 29 equivalent students. Beginning in Fiscal Year 2015 and thereafter, the program weights 30 for the English for speakers of other languages program and the programs for persons with 31 disabilities shall also earn school counselor funding. Further, beginning in Fiscal Year 32 2016 and thereafter, the program weights for the program for intellectually gifted students 33 and the remedial education program shall also earn school counselor funding. The duties 34 and responsibilities for such school counselors shall be established by the state board to 35 require a minimum of five of the six full-time equivalent program count segments of the 36 counselor's time to be spent counseling or advising students or parents. This subsection 37 shall stand repealed and reserved on July 1, 2026." 38 "(c.2)(1) As used in this subsection, the term 'trauma informed school counselor' means 39 a certificated professional personnel with a professional trauma informed school counseling endorsement provided for in Code Section 20-2-209.2. 40 41 Beginning in Fiscal Year 2027 and thereafter, the program weights for the

kindergarten, kindergarten early intervention, primary, primary grades early intervention,

upper elementary, upper elementary grades early intervention, middle school, alternative education programs, high school programs authorized pursuant to paragraph (4) of subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-151, English for speakers of other languages, persons with disabilities, for intellectually gifted students, and remedial education programs, when multiplied by the base amount, shall reflect sufficient funds to pay the beginning salaries for at least one trauma informed school counselor for every 150 full-time equivalent students. The duties and responsibilities for such trauma informed counselors shall be established by the state board to require a minimum of five of the six full-time equivalent program count segments of the trauma informed counselor's time to be spent counseling or advising students or parents."

53 SECTION 3.

54 Said article is further amended in Subpart 1 of Part 6, relating to certificated professional

55 personnel, by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

56 "20-2-209.2.

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- 57 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Trauma' means the result of an event, series of events, or set of circumstances that
- is experienced by an individual as physically or emotionally harmful or threatening and
- 60 that has lasting adverse effects on the individual's functioning and physical, social,
- 61 emotional, or spiritual well-being.
- 62 (2) 'Trauma informed counseling' means an approach to providing mental health support
- and counseling services that recognizes the impact of trauma on individuals and seeks to
- 64 <u>create a safe and supportive environment that promotes healing and resilience.</u>
- 65 (b) No later than December 31, 2024, the Professional Standards Commission, in
- 66 consultation with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities,
- shall create a professional trauma informed counseling endorsement for eligible certificated
- 68 professional personnel who elect to complete a trauma informed counseling program which

69 meets the minimum requirements provided in subsection (d) of this Code section and which

- is approved by the Professional Standards Commission.
- 71 (c) All eligible certificated professional personnel, as determined pursuant to rules and
- 72 <u>regulations of the Professional Standards Commission, who are employed in a public</u>
- 73 school in this state, complete a professional trauma informed counseling program approved
- by the Professional Standards Commission, and provide to the Professional Standards
- 75 <u>Commission verification of such completion from an approved provider shall receive the</u>
- 76 <u>professional trauma informed counseling endorsement.</u>
- 77 (d) To be eligible for approval by the Professional Standards Commission, a professional
- 78 <u>trauma informed counseling program shall, at a minimum, cover the following topics:</u>
- 79 (1) Recognizing different types of trauma in school-age children and evaluating the
- 80 <u>impact of trauma on their daily functioning;</u>
- 81 (2) Assessing for trauma related symptoms in school-age children;
- 82 (3) Understanding how traumatic experiences influence personal identity for school-age
- children and their ability to maintain healthy relationships;
- 84 (4) Understanding cultural competency, developing the ability to work with students
- from diverse backgrounds, and being aware of how cultural differences may impact
- 86 <u>trauma experiences and healing;</u>
- 87 (5) Providing trauma-sensitive mental health support and counseling services to
- 88 <u>school-age children to foster lasting change;</u>
- 89 (6) Helping school-age children process present trauma while addressing core trauma
- 90 <u>from the past;</u>
- 91 (7) Helping school-age children develop a clear understanding of techniques for
- 92 <u>emotional stabilization and positive self-care;</u>
- 93 (8) Helping school-age children understand personal agency, achieve resiliency, and
- 94 <u>create external anchors in the face of adversity; and</u>

95	(9) Understanding that collaboration with other school personnel, including, but not
96	limited to, teachers, school administrators, and school psychologists, is essential in
97	providing comprehensive support to students who have experienced trauma.
98	(e) The Professional Standards Commission, in consultation with the Department of
99	Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities, shall establish measures to assess the
100	fidelity of training and implementation for individuals who receive the professional trauma
101	informed counseling endorsement."
102	SECTION 4.
103	This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
104	without such approval.
105	SECTION 5.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.

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
