A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 10-1-393.5 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 prohibited telemarketing, Internet activities, or home repair, so as to provide that the
- 3 transmission of another person's medical information shall be deemed an unfair and
- 4 deceptive trade practice; to provide for a definition; to provide for cumulative remedies; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Code Section 10-1-393.5 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to prohibited
- 9 telemarketing, Internet activities, or home repair, is amended by adding a new subsection to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 "(b.2)(1) As used in this subsection, the term 'personal medical information' means
- evaluations, diagnoses, prognoses, laboratory reports, X-rays, prescriptions, and other
- technical information used in assessing an individual's physical or mental health
- condition from an individual's health record.
- 15 (2) Any person who is engaged in any activity involving or using a computer or
- 16 <u>computer network who transmits by electronic media or other form of medium personal</u>
- 17 <u>medical information of an individual without such individual's consent to any third party</u>
- individual or entity that is within this state shall be deemed to be transacting business in
- this state. Any such person shall be deemed to be committing an unlawful unfair and
- 20 <u>deceptive act or practice under this part.</u>
- 21 (3) This subsection shall be cumulative to any other remedies that may be available
- 22 <u>under the laws of this state or under the federal Health Insurance Portability and</u>
- 23 <u>Accountability Act of 1996, P.L. 104-191.</u>"
- SECTION 2.
- 25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
