A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 protection of disabled adults and elder persons, so as to create the Elder Financial
- 3 Exploitation Task Force; to provide for membership and duties; to provide a termination
- 4 date; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- 5 laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 5 of Title 30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to protection of
- 9 disabled adults and elder persons, is amended by designating the existing provisions of said
- 10 chapter as Article 1 and by adding thereafter a new article to read as follows:
- 11 "ARTICLE 2
- 12 <u>30-5-20.</u>
- 13 (a) There is created the Elder Financial Exploitation Task Force.
- 14 (b) The task force shall consist of eight members as follows:
- 15 (1) The director of the Division of Aging Services of the Department of Human Services
- or the director's designee;
- 17 (2) The commissioner of the Department of Banking and Finance or the commissioner's
- 18 <u>designee</u>;
- 19 (3) The chair of the Prosecuting Attorneys' Council of the State of Georgia or the chair's
- 20 <u>designee</u>;
- 21 (4) The director of the Consumer Protection Division of the Georgia Department of Law
- or the director's designee;
- 23 (5) The director of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation or the director's designee;
- 24 (6) The president of the Georgia Bankers Association or the president's designee;

25 (7) The chief executive officer of the Georgia Credit Union League or the chief

- 26 <u>executive officer's designee; and</u>
- 27 (8) The president of the Georgia Health Care Association or the president's designee.
- 28 (c) The task force shall be attached to the Department of Human Services for
- 29 <u>administrative purposes only as provided for in Code Section 50-4-3.</u>
- 30 <u>30-5-21.</u>
- 31 (a) The director of the Division of Aging Services of the Department of Human Services
- 32 or the director's designee shall call the first meeting of the task force, at which time the
- members shall elect a chair and vice chair.
- 34 (b) The chair of the task force may call on appropriate state agencies for reasonable
- 35 <u>assistance relating to the work of the task force.</u>
- 36 (c) The task force shall meet as often as necessary to carry out its duties pursuant to this
- 37 <u>article.</u>

- 39 (a) The task force shall:
- 40 (1) Assess the current status of elder and vulnerable adults as related to financial
- 41 <u>exploitation;</u>
- 42 (2) Examine the existing services and resources available to elder and vulnerable adults
- and any barriers to such services and resources; and
- 44 (3) Develop recommendations to address problems associated with the financial
- 45 <u>exploitation of elder and vulnerable adults.</u>
- 46 (b) The task force shall include an examination of the following in its assessment and
- 47 <u>recommendations:</u>
- 48 (1) The economic and human impact of financial exploitation of elder and vulnerable
- 49 <u>adults in this state;</u>
- 50 (2) The available remedies to reduce the number of individuals suffering such
- 51 <u>exploitation</u>;
- 52 (3) Legislative remedies for consideration by the General Assembly; and
- 53 (4) State policies or responses necessary to provide clear and coordinated services and
- 54 <u>support to protect and assist elder and vulnerable adults from financial exploitation.</u>
- 55 (c) The task force shall hold public meetings and utilize technological means, such as
- 56 webcasts, to gather information regarding its recommendations from the general public,
- 57 <u>including persons and families affected by poverty.</u>

58 (d) The task force shall submit its assessment and recommendations to the governor and

- 59 the general assembly in the form of a state plan to combat the abuse of elder and vulnerable
- adults no later than January 15, 2022.

- 62 (a) The commission shall terminate on January 16, 2022.
- (b) This article shall stand repealed on January 16, 2022, unless reauthorized by the
- 64 General Assembly prior to such date."
- 65 SECTION 2.
- 66 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
