A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to health of students in elementary and secondary education, so as to
- 3 provide for evidence based suicide awareness and training programs; to provide for a
- 4 definition; to provide for evidence based youth violence prevention training programs; to
- 5 provide for student violence prevention clubs; to provide for local policies for anonymous
- 6 reporting; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 10 relating to health of students in elementary and secondary education, is amended by revising
- 11 Code Section 20-2-779.1, relating to suicide prevention and awareness training and no duty
- 12 of care imposed, as follows:
- 13 "20-2-779.1.
- 14 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'evidence based' means a program or practice
- 15 <u>that:</u>

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(1) Demonstrates a statistically significant effect on relevant outcomes based on:

17 (A) Strong evidence from at least one well-designed and well-implemented 18 experimental study;

- 19 (B) Moderate evidence from at least one well-designed and well-implemented
- 20 <u>quasi-experimental study; or</u>
- 21 (C) Promising evidence from at least one well-designed and well-implemented
- 22 <u>correlational study with statistical controls for selection bias; or</u>
- 23 (2) Demonstrates a rationale based on high-quality research findings or positive
- 24 evaluation that such program or practice is likely to improve relevant outcomes, and
- 25 <u>includes ongoing efforts to examine the effects of such program or practice.</u>
- 26 (a)(1)(b) The Department State Board of Education shall adopt rules to require that:
- 27 (1) All all certificated public school personnel receive annual training in suicide
- awareness and prevention. This training shall be provided within the framework of
- 29 existing in-service training programs offered by the Department of Education or as part
- of required professional development offered by a local school system:
- 31 (2) Beginning in the 2026-2027 school year, and continuing each school year thereafter,
- 32 <u>all public schools serving students in grades six through 12 which receive funds in any</u>
- manner from the state shall provide to students at least one hour of evidence based
- 34 <u>suicide awareness and prevention training each school year. Such training may be</u>
- delivered in person, remotely, or digitally and may be included as part of the health and
- 36 physical education course of study provided for in subsection (c) of Code
- 37 <u>Section 20-2-142; and</u>
- 38 (3) All public schools serving students in any one of grades six through 12 which receive
- 39 <u>funds in any manner from the state shall provide to students at least one hour of evidence</u>
- 40 <u>based youth violence prevention training each school year.</u> Such training may be
- delivered in-person, remotely, or digitally and may be included as part of the health and
- 42 <u>physical education course of study provided for in subsection (c) of Code</u>
- 43 <u>Section 20-2-142.</u>

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(2)(c)(1) The Department of Education shall, in consultation with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities, the Suicide Prevention Program established pursuant to Code Section 37-1-27, and suicide prevention experts, develop a list of approved evidence based training materials to fulfill the requirements of this paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of this Code section which may include training materials currently being used by a local school system if such training materials meet any criteria established by the department. Such materials shall include training on how to identify appropriate mental health services, both within the school and also within the larger community, and when and how to refer youth and their families to those services. Such materials may include programs that can be completed through self-review of suitable suicide prevention materials.

- 55 (3) Approved materials shall include training on how to identify appropriate mental 56 health services, both within the school and also within the larger community, and when 57 and how to refer youth and their families to those services.
- (4) Approved materials may include programs that can be completed through self-review
 of suitable suicide prevention materials.
 - (2) By January 1, 2025, the Department of Education shall, in consultation with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities and the Suicide Prevention Program established pursuant to Code Section 37-1-27, develop and post a list of approved evidence based training materials, including no-cost programming, if any, to fulfill the requirements of paragraph (2) of subsection (b) of this Code section. Such materials shall, at a minimum, do all of the following:
- 66 (A) Teach school personnel how to identify the signs and symptoms of depression, 67 suicide, and self-injury in students;
- 68 (B) Teach school personnel when and how to refer youth and their families to
 69 appropriate mental health services for assessment both within the school and the larger
 70 community;

71 (C) Teach students how to recognize the observable signs and signals of depression,

- suicide, and self-injury in themselves and their peers; and
- 73 (D) Teach students the importance of seeking help for themselves and their peers, as
- well as the process for seeking help.
- 75 (3) By January 1, 2025, the Department of Education shall, in consultation with the
- 76 Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities and the Suicide
- Prevention Program established pursuant to Code Section 37-1-27, develop a list of
- approved evidence based training materials, including no-cost programming, if any, to
- fulfill the requirements of paragraph (3) of subsection (a). Such materials shall, at a
- 80 minimum, include all of the following:
- 81 (A) How to recognize the observable warning signs and signals of persons who may
- be at risk of harming themselves or others;
- 83 (B) The importance of taking threats seriously and seeking help; and
- 84 (C) The steps that can be taken to report dangerous, violent, threatening, harmful, or
- potentially harmful behavior.
- 86 (4)(A) The Department of Education shall make the lists of approved evidence based
- 87 <u>training materials required under this subsection, including no-cost programming, if</u>
- 88 <u>any, publicly available on its website.</u>
- 89 (B) The Department of Education shall keep the list of approved evidence based
- 90 <u>training materials timely updated by reviewing such list, at a minimum, every 36</u>
- 91 <u>months.</u>
- 92 (5) To assist public schools and local school systems in developing their own policies
- 93 for student suicide awareness and prevention as provided for in subsection (c) of this
- 94 Code section, the Department of Education, in consultation with the Department of
- 95 <u>Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities and the Suicide Prevention Program</u>
- 96 <u>established pursuant to Code Section 37-1-27</u>, shall establish a model policy for use by
- 97 <u>public schools and local school systems in accordance with this Code section.</u>

98 (5)(A)(d)(1) Each local school system board of education or public school governing 99 body shall: 100 (A) Adopt adopt a policy on student suicide awareness and prevention. Such policies 101 shall be developed in consultation with school and community stakeholders, school 102 employed mental health professionals, and suicide prevention experts, and shall, at a 103 minimum, address procedures relating to suicide prevention, intervention, and 104 postvention:; and 105 (B) Adopt a policy for providing relevant and current information to students and their families and to school personnel regarding publicly available resources for the 106 107 anonymous reporting of a dangerous, violent, threatening, harmful, or potentially harmful activity which occurs or is threatened to occur on school property or which 108 109 relates to students or school personnel. To assist local school systems in developing their own policies for student suicide prevention, the Department of Education, in 110 111 consultation with the Suicide Prevention Program within the Department of Behavioral 112 Health and Developmental Disabilities, shall establish a model policy for use by local 113 school systems in accordance with this Code section. 114 (2) Each public school serving students in any one of grades six through 12 that sponsors 115 student clubs shall sponsor a student-led student violence prevention club to sustain 116 awareness activities related to suicide prevention and violence prevention. 117 (b)(e) No person shall have a cause of action for any loss or damage caused by any act or omission resulting from the implementation of the provisions of this Code section or 118 resulting from any training, or lack thereof, required by this Code section. 119 (e)(f) The training, or lack thereof, required by the provisions of this Code section shall 120 not be construed to impose any specific duty of care." 121
