A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Part 7 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia 2 Annotated, relating to staff development under the "Quality Basic Education Act," so as to 3 require training programs for local boards of education to include certain provisions; to 4 require annual completion of such training program; to require such program to be delivered 5 by certain providers; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 6 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

9 Part 7 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
10 relating to staff development under the "Quality Basic Education Act," is amended by
11 revising subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-230, relating to programs, as follows:

12 "(b)(1) The State Board of Education shall adopt a training program for members of local 13 boards of education by July 1, 2011 <u>2023</u>. The State Board of Education may 14 periodically adopt revisions to such training program as it deems necessary; provided, 15 <u>however, that such training program shall include, but not be limited to, the code of ethics</u> 16 provided for by Code Section 20-2-72; conflicts of interest provisions applicable to

17	members of local boards of education; best practices for local boards of education on
18	school level governance, including, but not limited to, final decision-making authority in
19	personnel decisions, financial decisions, curriculum, resource allocation, establishing and
20	monitoring the achievement of school improvement goals, and school operations; the
21	fundamental roles of the board and the local school superintendent; the constitutional and
22	statutory requirements relating to public records and meetings; and the requirements of
23	applicable statutes, rules, and regulations; provided, further, that the training program
24	shall also include two to three hours annually regarding sound fiscal management and
25	monitoring the implementation of the local school system's budget in accordance with
26	state laws and regulations which includes the following elements:
27	(A) Board developed policies to ensure sound fiscal management, including, but not
28	limited to, budget requirements, spending level authorizations and permissions, deficit
29	spending, establishment of special funds, and management of reserve funds;
30	(B) Holding the local school superintendent accountable for the implementation of the
31	budget in a manner consistent with the local school system's strategic plan;
32	(C) Establishing, through policy, the level of spending beyond the budget for which the
33	local school superintendent must seek board approval;
34	(D) Monitoring the local school system's audits, monthly financial reports, and
35	additional financial reports needed to make informed decisions and to ensure execution
36	of the budget in a manner consistent with the strategic plan and strategic goals of the
37	local school system;
38	(E) Reviewing and addressing annually audited financial records and audit findings,
39	with a goal of proactively preventing audit exceptions;
40	(F) Addressing fiscal matters in a manner consistent with state law, sound business
41	practice, and ethical principles regarding conflicts of interest; and

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42 (G) Operating in a manner such that the board's financial decisions and actions do not
 43 provide unfair financial or other opportunistic advantages to any member of the local
 44 board of education, their family members, associates, or individual constituents.

(2) Within three months of adoption by the State Board of Education of a training
program pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection, each local board of education shall
adopt a training program for members of such boards that includes, at a minimum, such
training program and requirements established by the State Board of Education pursuant
to paragraph (1) of this subsection. Each local board of education shall incorporate any
revisions adopted by the State Board of Education to the training program pursuant to
paragraph (1) of this subsection within three months of adoption of such revisions.

52 (3) Members of each local board of education board shall annually complete the training 53 program provided for in this subsection, and such training program shall be delivered by 54 the Department of Education or a person or organization approved and certified by the 55 Department of Education as having the requisite knowledge, skills, and abilities to deliver 56 such training program.

57 (3)(4) All local boards of education are authorized to pay such board members for 58 attendance at a required training program the same per diem as authorized by local or 59 general law for attendance at regular meetings, as well as reimbursement of actual 60 expenses for travel, lodging, meals, and registration fees for such training, either before 61 or after such board members assume office."

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SECTION 2.

63 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
