A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 27-5-2.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 possession of cervid carcasses, so as to remove definitions; to amend which cervid parts may
- 3 be brought in from outside of Georgia; to authorize the Department of Natural Resources to
- 4 restrict the movement or transport of cervid carcasses, or carcass parts, upon detection of
- 5 chronic wasting disease in certain places; to provide for enforcement of violations; to provide
- 6 for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Code Section 27-5-2.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to possession of
- 10 cervid carcasses, is amended as follows:
- 11 "27-5-2.1.
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 13 (1) 'Cervid' means a member of the family cervidae.
- 14 (2) 'Chronic wasting disease' means a fatal disease that belongs to a group of diseases
- known as transmissible spongiform encephalopathies and that affects the brains of
- 16 cervids.

- 17 (3) 'Clean' means having no meat matter or tissue attached to the carcass part.
- 18 (4) 'Importation' means the transportation of a cervid, cervid carcass, or carcass part into
- this state.
- 20 $\frac{(5)(4)}{(5)(4)}$ 'Whole' means the entire carcass, whether eviscerated or not, prior to the carcass
- being processed.
- 22 (b)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, partnership, or association to import,
- bring, or cause to be imported or brought into this state any live cervid, except as
- otherwise authorized by rule or regulation of the board in effect as of January 1, 2007, or
- such later date as may be provided by Code Section 27-1-39.
- 26 (2)(A) Any person who violates paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be guilty of a
- 27 misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature and upon conviction shall be punished
- by a fine of not less than \$1,500.00 nor more than \$5,000.00, imprisonment for a period
- 29 not exceeding 12 months, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- 30 (B) The hunting and fishing privileges of any person convicted of violating
- paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be suspended for not less than three years from
- 32 the date of conviction.
- 33 (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to import or possess a whole cervid carcass or
- 34 cervid carcass part from any state having a documented case of a cervid infected with
- 35 chronic wasting disease place outside of Georgia, except for any one or more of the
- 36 following cervid carcass parts:
- 37 (1) Boned-out meat and commercially processed cuts of meat or products thereof;
- 38 (2) Portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached Antlers, skulls,
- 39 <u>skull plates, teeth, or jawbones with no soft tissue attached;</u>
- 40 (3) Hides with no heads attached; and
- 41 (4) Clean skull plates with antlers attached;
- 42 (5) Clean antlers;
- 43 (6) Finished taxidermy heads; and

- 44 (7) Clean upper canine teeth (buglers, whistlers, ivories) mounts.
- 45 (d) Upon the detection of chronic wasting disease in this state or any county adjacent to
- 46 the borders of this state, the department shall have the authority to restrict the movement
- or transport of cervid carcasses, or carcass parts within this state. A violation of any such
- 48 restriction shall be treated as a violation of this Code section."

49 **SECTION 2.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
