A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 7 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to medical assistance generally, so as to mandate Medicaid coverage when
- 3 pediatricians offer and perform maternal screening for perinatal mood and anxiety disorders;
- 4 to provide a definition; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 7 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 medical assistance generally, is amended by revising Code Section 49-4-159, relating to
- 10 Medicaid coverage for lactation and postpartum care, as follows:
- 11 "49-4-159.
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'perinatal mood and anxiety disorders' means a
- spectrum of disorders that may include depression, anxiety, panic disorder, bipolar
- disorder, obsessive-compulsive disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, or psychosis.
- 15 (b) The department shall provide Medicaid coverage for:

(1) Lactation care and services, as defined in paragraph (5) of Code Section 43-22A-3, 16 to pregnant and lactating women and to children who are breastfeeding or receiving their 17 mother's milk breastfed or bottle-fed infants and children; and 18 (2) Postpartum care for mothers for a period of one year following the date the 19 20 pregnancy ends. Such coverage shall include, but not be limited to, a screening for 21 perinatal mood and anxiety disorders when offered and performed by a pediatrician. (b) If necessary to implement the provisions of this Code section, the department shall 22 submit a Medicaid state plan amendment or waiver request to the United States Department 23
