## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
2	state flag, seal, and other symbols, so as to prohibit the display of monuments, memorials
3	plaques, markers, or memorabilia related to the Confederate States of America, slave owners
4	or persons advocating for slavery on public property except for museums and Civil War
5	battlefields; to remove reference to the preservation and protection of the memorial graver
6	upon the face of Stone Mountain; to remove reference to display of the flag of the
7	Confederate States of America from public buildings or schools; to amend Chapter 4 of
8	Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to holidays and observances so
9	as to remove provisions related to Confederate History and Heritage Month; to amend Part 4
10	of Article 6 of Chapter 3 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
11	the Stone Mountain Memorial Association, so as to remove reference to the confederate
12	memorial; to remove provisions for the sale of confederate memorabilia by the Stone
13	Mountain Memorial Association; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

16 SECTION 1.

date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

17 Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state flag, seal,

and other symbols, is amended by revising subsections (b) and (c) of Code Section 50-3-1,

19 relating to description of state flag, militia to carry flag, defacing public monuments, and

20 obstruction and relocation of monuments, as follows:

"(b)(1) As used in this subsection, the term:

22 (A) 'Agency' means any state or local government entity, including any department,

23 agency, bureau, authority, board, educational institution, commission, or

24 instrumentality or subdivision thereof, and specifically including a local board of

education, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, and any

26 institution of the University System of Georgia.

(B) 'Monument' means a monument, plaque, statue, marker, flag, banner, structure name, display, or memorial constructed and located with the intent of being permanently displayed and perpetually maintained that is:

- (i) Dedicated to a historical entity or historically significant military, religious, civil, civil rights, political, social, or cultural events or series of events; or
- (ii) Dedicated to, honors, or recounts the military service of any past or present military personnel of this state; the United States of America or the several states thereof; or the Confederate States of America or the several states thereof.
- (C) 'Officer' means an officer, official, body, employee, contractor, representative, or agent of any agency, whether appointed or elected.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or other entity to mutilate, deface, defile, or abuse contemptuously any publicly owned monument, plaque, marker, or memorial which is dedicated to, honors, or recounts the military service of any past or present military personnel of this state, the United States of America, or the several states thereof; and no officer, body, or representative of state or local government or any department, agency, authority, or instrumentality thereof located, erected, constructed, created, or maintained on real property owned by an agency or the State of Georgia. No officer or agency shall remove or conceal from display any such monument, plaque, marker, or memorial for the purpose of preventing the visible display of the same. A violation of this paragraph shall constitute a misdemeanor.
- (3)(2) No publicly owned monument <u>plaque</u>, <u>marker</u>, or <u>memorial</u> erected, constructed, created, or maintained on the public property of this state or its agencies, departments, authorities, or instrumentalities or on real property owned by an agency or the State of Georgia in honor of the military service of any past or present military personnel of this state, the United States of America, or the several states thereof shall be relocated, removed, concealed, obscured, or altered in any fashion by any officer or agency; provided, however, that appropriate measures for the preservation, protection, and interpretation of such <u>monument monuments</u>, <u>plaques</u>, <u>markers</u>, or <u>memorial memorials</u> shall not be prohibited.
- (4)(3) Any person or entity that damages, destroys, or loses a monument or that takes or removes a monument without replacing it shall be liable for treble the amount of the full cost of repair or replacement of such monument and may be subject to exemplary damages unless such person or entity was authorized to take such action by the public entity owning such monument. In addition to treble the cost of repair or replacement and possible exemplary damages, the person or entity shall also be liable for the attorney's fees and court costs expended by the public entity owner of the monument or person, group, or legal entity in any action or proceeding required to establish liability and collect

64 amounts owed. Should a public entity owner of the monument or person, group, or other legal entity prevail in any action under this Code section, such prevailing party shall 65 timely pay for the cost of or repair or placement of the monument upon moneys being 66 67 collected from the party damaging, destroying, or losing such monument Conduct prohibited by paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection shall be enjoined by the 68 69 appropriate superior court upon proper application therefor. (5) A public entity owning a monument or any person, group, or legal entity shall have 70 71 a right to bring a cause of action for any conduct prohibited by this Code section for 72 damages as permitted by this Code section. Such action shall be brought in the superior court of the county in which the monument was located. 73 74 (6)(4) Except as provided in this paragraph, it It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or other entity acting without authority to mutilate, deface, defile, abuse 75 contemptuously, relocate, remove, conceal, or obscure any privately owned monument, 76 77 plaque, marker, or memorial which is dedicated to, honors, or recounts the military service of any past or present military personnel of this state, the United States of 78 79 America, or the several states thereof <del>located on privately owned property</del>. Any person 80 or entity that who suffers injury or damages as a result of a violation of this paragraph 81 may bring an action individually or in a representative capacity against the person or 82 persons committing such violations to seek injunctive relief and to recover general and 83 exemplary damages sustained as a result of such person's or persons' unlawful actions. 84 This paragraph shall not apply to an owner of real property storing privately owned 85 monuments. 86 (7) Nothing in this Code section shall prevent an agency from relocating a monument when relocation is necessary for the construction, expansion, or alteration of edifices, 87 88 buildings, roads, streets, highways, or other transportation construction projects. Any 89 monument relocated for such purposes shall be relocated to a site of similar prominence, 90 honor, visibility, and access within the same county or municipality in which the monument was originally located. A monument shall not be relocated to a museum, 91 92 cemetery, or mausoleum unless it was originally placed at such location." 93 "(c)(1) Any other provision of law notwithstanding, the memorial to the heroes of the Confederate States of America graven upon the face of Stone Mountain shall never be 94 95 altered, removed, concealed, or obscured in any fashion and shall be preserved and protected for all time as a tribute to the bravery and heroism of the citizens of this state 96 who suffered and died in their cause. Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this 97 subsection, no publicly or privately owned monument, plaque, marker, memorial, or 98 99 memorabilia dedicated to, honoring, or recounting:

100	(A) The Confederate States of America, the several states thereof, or the military	
101	service of military personnel thereof;	
102	(B) Any individual, group, or organizations that owned, possessed, or controlled	
103	enslaved persons; or	
104	(C) Any individual, group, or organization that encouraged, promoted, supported, or	
105	advocated for the continuation of slavery	
106	shall be erected, constructed, created, displayed, or maintained on the public property of	
107	this state or its agencies, departments, authorities, instrumentalities, counties,	
108	municipalities, political subdivisions, or local authorities.	
109	(2) Monuments, plaques, markers, or memorials related to the persons, institutions, or	
110	organizations outlined in subparagraphs (A) through (C) of paragraph (1) of this	
111	subsection may be displayed and maintained in museums owned or operated by the state	
112	or its agencies, departments, authorities, instrumentalities, counties, municipalities,	
113	political subdivisions, or local authorities or within the boundaries of Civil War	
114	battlefields provided for in the State of Georgia Civil War Sites Heritage Plan adopted	
115	pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 7 of this title.	
116	(3) On or after January 1, 2021, conduct prohibited by paragraph (1) of this subsection	
117	shall be enjoined by the appropriate superior court upon proper application therefor, and	
118	the sovereign immunity of the state, its agencies, departments, authorities,	
119	instrumentalities, counties, municipalities, political subdivisions, and local authorities is	
120	waived to the extent necessary to effectuate this subsection.	
121	(4) This subsection shall not provide a right of action or waive sovereign immunity in	
122	regard to any claim of injury or damage arising from the removal of a privately owned	
123	monument, plaque, marker, memorial, or memorabilia from public property pursuant to	
124	paragraph (1) of this subsection.	
125	(5) Compliance or attempts to comply with paragraph (1) of this subsection shall not be	
126	violations of either subsection (e) of Code Section 16-7-21 or paragraph (7) of	
127	subsection (a) of Code Section 16-8-12."	
128	SECTION 2.	
129	Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 50-3-10, relating to use of flag for	
130	decorative or patriotic purposes, as follows:	
131	"50-3-10.	
132	Nothing in this article shall be construed to prevent the use of the flag of the United States	
133	or any flag, standard, color, shield, ensign, or other insignia of the State of Georgia or of	
134	the Confederate States of America for decorative or patriotic purposes, either inside or	

outside of any residence, store, place of business, public building, or school building."

137 Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to holidays and

- observances, is amended by repealing and reserving Code Section 1-4-20 relating to
- designation of Confederate History and Heritage Month.

**SECTION 4.** 

- 141 Part 4 of Article 6 of Chapter 3 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- relating to the Stone Mountain Memorial Association, is amended by revising paragraph (7)
- of Code Section 12-3-191, relating to definitions, as follows:
- 144 "(7) 'Project' means Stone Mountain and property adjacent thereto acquired by the
- association and all accommodations, utilities, facilities, services, and equipment
- necessary or convenient, and all property, real, personal, or mixed, used or useful,
- including franchises and easements, in constructing, erecting, improving, remodeling,
- developing, equipping, adding to, extending, maintaining, managing, and operating Stone
- Mountain, located in DeKalb County, Georgia, and property adjacent thereto, as a
- 150 Confederate memorial and public recreational area, and the construction, improvement,
- development, maintenance, management, operation, and extension of any part thereof,
- as to which the association has undertaken or agreed to undertake any action permitted
- by this part."

154 SECTION 5.

- 155 Said part is further amended by revising Code Section 12-3-192.1, relating to purposes of the
- association, as follows:
- 157 "12-3-192.1.
- The purposes of the Stone Mountain Memorial Association shall include:
- (1) To preserve the natural areas situated within the Stone Mountain Park area; and
- 160 (2) To provide access to Stone Mountain for Georgia's citizens; and
- 161 (3) To maintain an appropriate and suitable memorial for the Confederacy."
- 162 **SECTION 6.**
- Said part is further amended by repealing subsection (d) of Code Section 12-3-194.1, relating
- to police and legislative powers of the association and the sale of confederate memorabilia.
- 165 **SECTION 7.**
- 166 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- without such approval.

168 **SECTION 8.** 

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
