A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 2 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to competencies and core curriculum under the "Quality Basic Education
- 3 Act," so as to require that any course of study in sex education and HIV/AIDS prevention
- 4 instruction is age appropriate and provides instruction on consent and intimate partner
- 5 violence and abuse; to establish new requirements on the prescribed course for human
- 6 trafficking awareness; to require the course on awareness and prevention of sex abuse and
- 7 assault be taught through the twelfth grade; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 8 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Part 2 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 12 relating to competencies and core curriculum under the "Quality Basic Education Act," is
- amended in paragraph (2) of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-142, relating to prescribed
- 14 courses, as follows:

- 15 "(2) The State Board of Education shall prescribe a an age-appropriate course of study
- in human trafficking awareness and prevention for grades six through 12, three through

17 <u>12,</u> which may be included as part of the health and physical education course of study 18 provided for in paragraph (1) of this subsection. <u>Such course on human trafficking</u> 19 awareness and prevention shall:

- (A) Include instruction on the prevalence, nature, and varieties of human trafficking, including, but not limited to, forced labor, sex trafficking, and debt bondage;
- 22 (B) Provide strategies to reduce the risk of experiencing human trafficking;
- 23 (C) Provide resources and best practices to safely seek assistance;
- 24 (D) Explain how social media, the internet, and smartphone applications are used in
- 25 <u>recruiting victims of human trafficking; and</u>
- 26 (E) Review common misconceptions and stereotypes about human trafficking."

SECTION 2.

- 28 Said article is further amended in Code Section 20-2-143, relating to sex education and AIDS
- 29 prevention instruction, implementation, and student exemption, as follows:

- 31 (a) Each local board of education shall prescribe a an age-appropriate course of study in
- 32 sex education and AIDS human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) prevention instruction for
- 33 such grades and grade levels in the public school system as shall be determined by the State
- 34 Board of Education. Such course of study shall implement either the minimum course of
- 35 study provided for in subsection (b) of this Code section or its equivalent, as approved by
- 36 the State Board of Education. Each local board of education shall be authorized to
- 37 supplement and develop the exact approach of content areas of such minimum course of
- 38 study with such specific curriculum standards as it may deem appropriate. Such standards
- shall include <u>age-appropriate</u> instruction <u>relating to concerning consent</u>, the handling of
- 40 peer pressure, the promotion of high self-esteem, local community values, the legal
- 41 consequences of parenthood, and abstinence from sexual activity as an effective method

of prevention of pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and acquired immune deficiency

- 43 syndrome HIV/AIDS.
- 44 (b) The State Board of Education shall prescribe a an age-appropriate minimum course of
- study in sex education and AIDS HIV/AIDS prevention instruction which may be included
- as a part of a course of study in comprehensive health education for such grades and grade
- levels in the public school system as shall be determined by the state board and shall
- 48 establish standards for its administration. The course may include instruction concerning
- 49 human biology, conception, pregnancy, birth, sexually transmitted diseases, and acquired
- 50 immune deficiency syndrome <u>HIV/AIDS</u>. The course shall include instruction concerning
- 51 the legal consequences of parenthood, including, without being limited to, the legal
- obligation of both parents to support a child and legal penalties or restrictions upon failure
- 53 to support a child, including, without being limited to, the possible suspension or
- revocation of a parent's driver's license and occupational or professional licenses. The
- course shall include instruction for students in grades six through 12 on intimate partner
- violence and abuse, including, but not limited to:
- 57 (1) The definition of intimate partner violence and abuse;
- 58 (2) Warning signs of intimate partner violence and abusive behavior;
- 59 (3) The characteristics of healthy and unhealthy relationships;
- 60 (4) Measures to prevent and stop intimate partner violence and abuse;
- 61 (5) Resources available to victims of intimate partner violence and abuse; and
- 62 (6) A review of common misconceptions and stereotypes about intimate partner violence
- 63 <u>and abuse.</u>
- The course shall also include annual age-appropriate instruction for students in
- kindergarten through grade 12 concerning consent and the awareness and prevention of
- sexual abuse and assault awareness and prevention education in kindergarten through grade
- 67 nine which shall include:
- (1) Age-appropriate information on behaviors that constitute sexual abuse and assault;

- 69 (2) Strategies to reduce the risk of experiencing sexual abuse and assault;
- 70 (3) Resources and reporting procedures for a student that experiences sexual abuse and
- 71 <u>assault; and</u>
- 72 (4) Age-appropriate review of common misconceptions and stereotypes about sexual
- abuse and assault.
- A manual setting out the details of such course of study shall be prepared by or approved
- by the State School Superintendent in cooperation with the Department of Public Health,
- the State Board of Education, and such expert advisers as they may choose.
- 77 (c) The minimum course of study to be prescribed by the State Board of Education
- pursuant to subsection (b) of this Code section shall be ready for implementation not later
- than July 1, 1988 October 1, 2024. Each local board shall implement either such minimum
- course of study or its equivalent not later than July 1, 1989 <u>2025</u>. Any local board of
- 81 education which fails to comply with this subsection shall not be eligible to receive any
- state funding under this article until such minimum course of study or its equivalent has
- been implemented.
- 84 (d) Any parent or legal guardian of a child to whom the course of study set forth in this
- Code section is to be taught shall have the right to elect, in writing, that such child not
- 86 receive such course of study."
- SECTION 3.
- 88 Said article is further amended in Code Section 20-2-201, relating to specific course
- 89 requirements, in-service or continuing education, and online offerings, by revising subsection
- 90 (b) as follows:
- 91 "(b) Each local unit of administration shall be required to provide all professional
- 92 personnel certificated by the Professional Standards Commission 12 clock hours of
- 93 in-service or continuing education in each calendar year, or meet requirements of the
- 94 Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Such in-service programs shall be

developed by the local unit of administration in conjunction with such agencies as regional educational service agencies, colleges and universities, and other appropriate organizations. These programs shall be designed to address identified needs determined by appropriate personnel evaluation instruments. These programs shall also focus on improving the skills of certificated personnel that directly relate to improving student achievement, as reflected in the revised certification renewal rules established by the Professional Standards Commission pursuant to paragraph (4.1) of subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-200 regarding the impact of professional learning on student achievement. These programs shall also include in-service training programs on sexual abuse and assault awareness and prevention for professional personnel who will be providing instruction in annual age-appropriate sexual abuse and assault awareness and prevention education in kindergarten through grade nine 12 pursuant to subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-143. Records of attendance shall be maintained by local units of administration and shall be monitored by appropriate Department of Education staff."

SECTION 4.
