## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 3 of Chapter 2 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to prestige license plates and special license plates for certain persons and vehicles, so as to provide for the issuance of a special and distinctive license plate for veteran spouses in certain instances; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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## **SECTION 1.**

Article 3 of Chapter 2 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
prestige license plates and special license plates for certain persons and vehicles, is amended
by revising Code Section 40-2-85.1, relating to special and distinctive license plates for
certain veterans, as follows:
"40-2-85.1.
(a) For purposes of this Code section, the term:
(1) 'Military medal award' means the following medals, decorations, or other recognition

15 of honor for military service awarded by a branch of the United States military:

16 (A) Medal of Honor;

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17	(B) Bronze Star Medal;
18	(C) Silver Star Medal;
19	(D) Distinguished Service Cross;
20	(E) Navy Cross;

33	(R) Soldier's Medal.
34	(2) 'Served during active military combat' means active duty service in World War I,
35	World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, Operation Desert Storm, the Global
36	War on Terrorism as defined by Presidential Executive Order 13289, Section 2, the war
37	in Afghanistan, or the war in Iraq, which includes either Operation Iraqi Freedom or
38	Operation Enduring Freedom.
39	(3) 'Veteran' means a former member of the armed forces of the United States who is
40	discharged from the armed forces under conditions other than dishonorable.
41	(4) 'Woman veteran' and 'women veterans' means $\underline{a}$ former members member of the
42	armed forces of the United States who are is female and discharged from the armed
43	forces under conditions other than dishonorable.

(b)(1) Motor vehicle and trailer owners who are veterans or women veterans, who have
received a military medal award, or who served during active military combat shall be
eligible to receive special and distinctive vehicle license plates for private passenger cars,
motorcycles, trucks, or recreational vehicles used for personal transportation. Such
license plates shall be issued in compliance with the state motor vehicle laws relating to
registration and licensing of motor vehicles as prescribed in Article 2 of this chapter.

50 (2)(A) Motor vehicle and trailer owners who are veterans or women veterans, who 51 have received a military medal award, or who served during active military combat 52 shall be issued upon application for and upon compliance with the state motor vehicle 53 laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles a veteran's license plate, a 54 woman veteran's license plate, a military medal award recipient license plate, or a commemorative service license plate for service during active military combat. One 55 56 such license plate shall be issued without the requisite registration fee, manufacturing 57 fee, or annual registration fee.

58 (B) Each member or former member of the armed forces of the United States listed in 59 this subsection shall be entitled to no more than one such free license plate at a time; 60 provided, however, that upon payment of a manufacturing fee of \$25.00, a member 61 shall be entitled to one additional such license plate. For each additional license plate 62 for which a \$25.00 manufacturing fee is required, there shall be an additional annual 63 registration fee of \$25.00, and such fee shall be collected by the county tag agent at the 64 time of collection of other registration fees and shall be remitted to the state as provided 65 in Code Section 40-2-34.

(c) The commissioner shall design a veteran's license plate, a woman veteran's license
plate, a military medal award recipient license plate, <u>a veteran spouse's license plate</u>, and
a license plate to commemorate service with the United States armed forces during active
military combat. The commissioner shall promulgate such rules and regulations as may
be necessary to enforce compliance with all state license laws relating to the use and

71 operation of private passenger cars, motorcycles, trucks, and trailers before issuing such 72 license plates in lieu of the regular Georgia license plates. The manufacturing fee for such 73 veteran spouse special and distinctive license plates shall be \$25.00. The commissioner 74 is specifically authorized to promulgate all rules and regulations necessary to ensure 75 compliance in instances where such vehicles have been transferred or sold. Except as 76 provided in subsection (e) of this Code section, such plates shall be nontransferable.

77 (d) The special and distinctive vehicle license plates shall be as prescribed in Article 2 of 78 this chapter for private passenger cars, motorcycles, trucks, recreational vehicles, and 79 trailers used for personal transportation. Such plates shall contain such words or symbols, 80 in addition to the numbers and letters prescribed by law, so as to identify distinctively the 81 owners who are veterans, women veterans, or spouses of veterans; who are recipients of a military medal award; or who served during active military combat and shall additionally 82 83 identify distinctly the owner as a current or former member of one of the following 84 branches of the armed forces of the United States: Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, or 85 Coast Guard or the spouse of a veteran of one of such branches. License plates issued 86 pursuant to this Code section need not contain a place for the county name decal as 87 provided in Code Section 40-2-9.

88 (e) The license plate issued pursuant to this Code section shall be transferred between 89 vehicles as provided in Code Section 40-2-80. The spouse of a deceased veteran or of a 90 deceased person who received a military medal award or who served during active military 91 combat shall continue to be eligible to be issued a distinctive personalized veteran spouse's 92 license plate as provided in this Code section for any vehicle owned by such person, 93 ownership of which is transferred to the surviving spouse or for any other vehicle owned 94 by such surviving spouse either at the time of the qualifying person's death or acquired 95 thereafter, so long as such surviving spouse does not remarry.

96 (e.1) The spouse of any person eligible to be issued a special license plate under this Code

97 section shall also be eligible for such license plate, provided that no motor vehicle is

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98 registered in the name of the eligible person and all other requirements relating to 99 registration and licensing relative to motor vehicles as prescribed in Article 2 of this

100 chapter have been satisfied.

101 (f) Special license plates issued under this Code section, except as provided in

102 subparagraph (b)(2)(A) of this Code section, shall be renewed annually with a revalidation

- 103 decal as provided in Code Section 40-2-31 without payment of an additional \$25.00 annual
- 104 registration fee."

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## SECTION 2.

106 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
