A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 31-2A-18 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
Low THC Oil Patient Registry, so as to add ulcerative colitis as a condition for which low
THC oil may be used for treatment; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws;
and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6	SECTION 1.
7	Code Section 31-2A-18 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Low THC
8	Oil Patient Registry, is amended by revising paragraph (3) of subsection (a) as follows:
9	"(3) 'Condition' means:
10	(A) Cancer, when such disease is diagnosed as end stage or the treatment produces
11	related wasting illness or recalcitrant nausea and vomiting;
12	(B) Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, when such disease is diagnosed as severe or end
13	stage;
14	(C) Seizure disorders related to a diagnosis of epilepsy or trauma related head injuries;
15	(D) Multiple sclerosis, when such disease is diagnosed as severe or end stage;
16	(E) Crohn's disease;

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17	(F) Mitochondrial disease;
18	(G) Parkinson's disease, when such disease is diagnosed as severe or end stage;
19	(H) Sickle cell disease, when such disease is diagnosed as severe or end stage;
20	(I) Tourette's syndrome, when such syndrome is diagnosed as severe;
21	(J) Autism spectrum disorder, when such disorder is diagnosed for a patient who is at
22	least 18 years of age, or severe autism, when diagnosed for a patient who is less than
23	18 years of age;
24	(K) Epidermolysis bullosa;
25	(L) Alzheimer's disease, when such disease is diagnosed as severe or end stage;
26	(M) Acquired immune deficiency syndrome, when such syndrome is diagnosed as
27	severe or end stage;
28	(N) Peripheral neuropathy, when such symptoms are diagnosed as severe or end stage;
29	(O) Post-traumatic stress disorder resulting from direct exposure to or the witnessing
30	of a trauma for a patient who is at least 18 years of age; or
31	(P) Intractable pain <u>; or</u>
32	(Q) Ulcerative colitis."

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SECTION 2.

34 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
