A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 7 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 regulation and construction of hospitals and other health care facilities, so as to provide for
- 3 screening, training, and supervision of home health aides; to require certification in
- 4 cardiopulmonary resuscitation; to provide for backup home health aides; to require liability
- 5 insurance coverage; to provide for responsibility of a home health agency for negligence and
- 6 willful misconduct by home health aides; to provide that home health aides are subject to
- 7 criminal background checks; to provide for related matters; to provide for a short title; to
- 8 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

11 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "TLC Act."

12 SECTION 2.

- 13 Chapter 7 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to regulation and
- 14 construction of hospitals and other health care facilities, is amended by revising Code Section

31-7-153, relating to standards for patient care and agency operation, regulations as to issuance, denial, suspension, or revocation of licenses, and hearings, as follows:

- 17 "31-7-153.
- 18 The department shall promulgate regulations which define standards for the care, treatment, 19 health, safety, welfare, and comfort of patients served by home health agencies and for the 20 maintenance and operation of home health agencies which will promote safe and adequate 21 care and treatment of the patients. These regulations shall be no less stringent than those 22 required for participation of home health agencies in the Title XVIII medicare Medicare 23 program and shall include, but not be limited to, a provision requiring the agency to have 24 policies established by a professional group which includes at least one physician and one 25 registered nurse and appropriate representation from other professional disciplines; 26 provisions governing the services the agency provides; provisions for the supervision of 27 services by a physician or registered nurse, as appropriate; and maintenance of clinical 28 records on all patients, including a plan of treatment prescribed by a physician; and 29 provisions for ensuring proper screening, training, and supervision of home health aides, 30 whether such aides are employees or independent contractors of the agency. 31 department is authorized to issue, deny, suspend, or revoke licenses in accordance with

35 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

hearing procedures related to denial, suspension, or revocation of licenses."

36 "<u>31-7-158.1.</u>

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37 (a) All home health aides shall possess current certification in cardiopulmonary

regulations promulgated pursuant to this Code section. Such regulations shall also include

- 38 <u>resuscitation</u>, whether such aides are employees or independent contractors of the home
- 39 <u>health agency.</u>

40 (b) A home health agency shall ensure that a backup home health aide is available at all

- 41 <u>times to report for work at a patient's residence in the event that the originally scheduled</u>
- 42 <u>home health aide is unable to or fails to report for work at such patient's residence.</u>
- 43 (c) A home health agency shall carry or be covered by liability insurance coverages for a
- 44 <u>claim against the home health agency for acts of negligence or willful misconduct of its</u>
- 45 <u>home health aides.</u>
- 46 (d) A home health agency shall be responsible for acts of negligence or willful misconduct
- of a home health aide, whether such aide is an employee or independent contractor of such
- 48 agency, that result in property damage or personal injury to a patient."

49 **SECTION 4.**

- 50 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 31-7-351, relating to definitions relative to
- 51 the "Georgia Long-term Care Background Check Program," by revising paragraph (7) as
- 52 follows:
- 53 "(7) 'Employee' means any individual who has direct access and who is hired by a facility
- through employment, or through a contract with such facility, including, but not limited
- 55 to, housekeepers, maintenance personnel, dieticians, and any volunteer who has duties
- that are equivalent to the duties of an employee providing such services. Such term shall
- 57 not include an individual who contracts with the facility, whether personally or through
- a company, to provide utility, construction, communications, accounting, quality
- assurance, human resource management, information technology, legal, or other services
- if the contracted services are not directly related to providing services to a patient,
- resident, or client of the facility. Such term shall include a home health aide employed
- by or contracted with a home health agency. Such term shall not include any health care
- provider, including, but not limited to, physicians, dentists, nurses, and pharmacists who
- are licensed by the Georgia Composite Medical Board, the Georgia Board of Dentistry,
- 65 the Georgia Board of Nursing, or the State Board of Pharmacy."

66 SECTION 5.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
