## House Bill 1428

# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 9 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 consent for surgical or medical treatment, so as to prohibit pelvic and rectal examinations on 3 an anesthetized or unconscious patient without consent or a court order except in cases of 4 emergency; to provide for an exception; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting 5 laws; and for other purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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## **SECTION 1.**

8 Chapter 9 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to consent for 9 surgical or medical treatment, is amended by revising subsections (g) and (h) of and by 10 adding a new subsection to Code Section 31-9-6.1, relating to disclosure of certain 11 information to persons undergoing certain surgical or diagnostic procedures, failure to 12 comply, exceptions, and regulations establishing standards for implementation, to read as 13 follows:

14 "(g)(1) A responsible physician shall not perform a pelvic or rectal examination on an
anesthetized or unconscious patient unless:

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16	(A) The patient or a person authorized to consent for the patient gives informed
17	consent to such examination;
18	(B) The performance of such examination is within the scope of care ordered for the
19	patient; and
20	(C) Such examination is medically necessary for diagnosis or treatment purposes;
21	provided, however, that informed consent shall not be required pursuant to this subsection
22	in the event of an emergency, as defined in Code Section 31-9-3.
23	(2) A responsible physician may perform a pelvic or rectal examination on an
24	anesthetized or unconscious patient when a court has ordered the performance of the
25	pelvic or rectal examination for the purposes of evidence collection.
26	(3) A physician or student undertaking a course of professional instruction or a clinical
27	training program shall not perform a pelvic or rectal examination on an anesthetized or
28	unconscious patient for the purposes of instruction or clinical training unless the patient
29	has given informed consent to the pelvic or rectal examination and such instruction or
30	training.
31	(g)(h) The Georgia Composite Medical Board shall be required to adopt and have the
32	authority to promulgate rules and regulations governing and establishing the standards
33	necessary to implement this chapter specifically including but not limited to the
34	disciplining of a physician who fails to comply with this Code section.
35	(h)(i) As used in this Code section, the term 'responsible physician' means the physician
36	who performs the procedure or the physician under whose direct orders the procedure is
37	performed by a nonphysician."

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## **SECTION 2.**

39 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
