## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 6 of Chapter 8 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to operation of trains at crossings, so as to prohibit the operation of a
- 3 train in a manner that occupies or blocks a street, road, or highway grade crossing longer than
- 4 a certain amount of time; to provide for exceptions; to provide for immunity from penalty
- 5 in certain instances; to provide for penalties; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 6 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Part 3 of Article 6 of Chapter 8 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 10 relating to operation of trains at crossings, is amended by revising Code Section 46-8-197,
- 11 relating to legal responsibility of member of train crew, yard crew, or engine crew for
- 12 occupying or blocking street, road, or highway grade crossing pursuant to employer's order,
- 13 as follows:

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- 14 "46-8-197.
- 15 (a) No railroad common carrier shall authorize the operation of a train in a manner that
- occupies or blocks any street, road, or highway grade crossing by engines or passenger or

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17 <u>freight cars longer than 15 consecutive minutes unless the train is in motion or such</u>

- 18 <u>blockage is:</u>
- 19 (1) Due to a power brake failure or other mechanical failure;
- 20 (2) Necessary to avoid striking any object or person on the track;
- 21 (3) Due to a derailment or other accident; or
- 22 (4) In order to comply with a federal safety directive or regulation or other federal law.
- 23 (b) No member of a train crew, yard crew, or engine crew of a railroad common carrier
- shall be held personally responsible under, or found guilty of violating, any this Code
- 25 <u>section or any other</u> state laws or municipal ordinances regulating or intended to regulate
- 26 the occupying or blocking of any street, road, or highway grade crossing by engines or
- passenger or freight cars, upon reasonable proof by the provided by such crew member that
- the occupying or blocking of the grade crossing was necessary to comply with the orders
- or instructions, either written or oral, of his or her employer or of the officers or
- 30 supervisory officials of the company owning the railroad over which the engine or cars are
- operated; provided, however, that this Code section subsection shall not relieve the such
- 32 employer or railroad such company owning the railroad from any responsibility placed
- upon such employee or railroad company by any such company owning the railroad by this
- 34 <u>Code section or any other</u> state laws or municipal ordinances.
- 35 (c)(1) The commission shall be authorized to impose a civil monetary penalty upon any
- railroad common carrier determined to have violated this Code section.
- 37 (2) Any civil monetary penalty assessed pursuant to this subsection shall be \$500.00 for
- 38 every five minutes a train blocks or occupies a street, road, or highway grade crossing
- beyond the time allowed pursuant subsection (a) of this Code section."

40 SECTION 2.

41 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
