A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 elections and primaries generally, so as to afford employees time off to vote on days of
- 3 advance voting in addition to election days; to provide that employers may request that an
- 4 employee provide proof that he or she presented himself or herself at the polling place; to
- 5 provide that polling officers and absentee ballot clerks provide electors such proof upon
- 6 request; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to primaries and
- 10 elections generally, is amended by revising Code Section 21-2-404, relating to affording
- 11 employees time off to vote, as follows:

- Each employee in this state shall, upon reasonable notice to his or her employer, be
- permitted by his or her employer to take any necessary time off from his or her
- employment to vote in any municipal, county, state, or federal political party primary or
- election for which such employee is qualified and registered to vote. Such time off may

occur on either the day on which such primary or election is held or on a day of advanced voting for such election as provided for in subsection (d) of Code Section 21-2-385; provided, however, that such necessary time off shall not exceed two hours; and provided, further, that, if the hours of work of such employee commence at least two hours after the opening of the polls or end at least two hours prior to the closing of the polls, then the time off for voting as provided for in this Code section shall not be available. The employer may specify the hours during which the employee may absent himself or herself as provided in this Code section and may request that the employee provide proof that he or she presented himself or herself at the polling place. Poll officers and absentee ballot clerks shall, upon the request of an elector, provide such elector with documentation evidencing that the elector presented himself or herself at the polling place."

29 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
