A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to mandatory reporting requirements for nurses, so as to require the Georgia Board
- 3 of Nursing to transmit copies of certain complaints and reports received relating to care
- 4 rendered in certain settings which requires physician involvement; to provide for a definition;
- 5 to provide for confidentiality; to provide for an exception; to provide for related matters; to
- 6 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Article 3 of Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 10 mandatory reporting requirements for nurses, is amended by adding a new Code section to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 "43-26-56.

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- 13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'prescription product' means a device that the
- 14 <u>federal Food and Drug Administration has designated under Section 201(h) of the Federal</u>
- Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. Section 321(h)) as a prescription medical device
- and can be sold only to persons with prescriptive authority, or any human drug required by

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17 federal law or regulation to be dispensed only by a prescription, including finished dosage 18 forms and active ingredients subject to Section 503(b) of the Federal Food, Drug, and 19 Cosmetic Act. 20 (b) On and after July 1, 2024, notwithstanding Code Section 43-1-21, when the board 21 receives a complaint or report regarding care rendered by a licensee in an outpatient setting 22 that requires physician involvement, including, but not limited to, ordering or procuring 23 prescription products, the administration of prescription products, or the ordering or 24 prescribing of prescription products pursuant to a nurse protocol agreement, the board shall immediately transmit a copy of such complaint or report to the Georgia Composite Medical 25 26 Board, as well as any ongoing investigative materials related to such complaint or report. 27 (c) No later than December 31, 2024, notwithstanding Code Section 43-1-21, the board 28 shall transmit to the Georgia Composite Medical Board a copy of all complaints and 29 reports received by the board between January 1, 2021, and June 30, 2024, regarding care 30 rendered by a licensee in an outpatient setting that requires physician involvement, including, but not limited to, ordering or procuring prescription products, the 31 32 administration of prescription products, or the ordering or prescribing of prescription 33 products pursuant to a nurse protocol agreement, including any investigative materials 34 received by the board prior to or after June 30, 2024, related to such complaints and 35 reports. 36 (d) The Georgia Composite Medical Board shall comply with and be subject to the same 37 confidentiality requirements with respect to any written documents or communications or 38 other information relating to a complaint or report, including any related investigative 39 materials, which are transmitted to the Georgia Composite Medical Board by the board, in 40 the same manner and to the same extent as the board. 41 (e) This Code section shall not apply to complaints or reports received by the board 42 relating to medications provided or administered by a licensee through a home health agency as defined in Code Section 31-7-150." 43

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44 **SECTION 2.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed. 45
