A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 40 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions relative to promotion and deployment of broadband services,
- 3 so as to provide for the duties, membership, chairperson, meetings, reports, and
- 4 reimbursement of a task force to be established to evaluate and monitor the broadband equity
- 5 of state-funded broadband network projects; to require state agencies to cooperate with and
- 6 provide certain information to the task force; to provide for the Georgia Technology
- 7 Authority to promulgate certain policies concerning such task force; to provide for automatic
- 8 repeal; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Article 1 of Chapter 40 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 12 general provisions relative to promotion and deployment of broadband services, is amended
- 13 by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 14 "<u>50-40-4.</u>
- 15 (a) There is established the Broadband Equity Task Force, which shall consist of five
- members as follows:

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- 17 (1) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 18 (2) Two members appointed by the President of the Senate; and
- 19 (3) One member appointed by the Governor.
- 20 (b) At its first organizational meeting, the task force shall elect from among its members
- 21 <u>a chairperson who shall serve as such for the duration of the existence of the task force.</u>
- 22 The chairperson shall call all meetings of the task force and preside over such meetings.
- The members may also elect such other officers from among their number as they deem
- 24 appropriate. In the event that the chairperson's position becomes vacant, the task force
- shall elect a new chairperson from among its legislative members following the
- 26 <u>appointment of a new legislative member.</u>
- 27 (c) Each task force member shall serve for a two-year term and until a successor is
- 28 appointed and qualified. No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms.
- 29 <u>Vacancies in the task force shall be filled by appointment in the manner of the original</u>
- 30 <u>appointment. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.</u>
- 31 (d) The task force shall review and monitor all broadband network projects funded or
- 32 proposed to be funded with state funds and make recommendations to the Georgia
- 33 Technology Authority as to whether each broadband network project encourages and
- 34 <u>fosters broadband equity within the state by evaluating whether such broadband network</u>
- 35 project:
- 36 (1) Provides equitable deployment of broadband services to rural, low-income, and
- 37 <u>historically disenfranchised communities;</u>
- 38 (2) Utilizes data-driven, economically inclusive development strategies and
- implementation plans deployed down to a neighborhood level; and
- 40 (3) Includes community planning and budgeting processes designed to highlight local
- 41 <u>assets scaled for community economic growth.</u>
- 42 (e) The task force shall make a report with its findings and recommendations regarding
- 43 <u>each broadband network project to the Georgia Technology Authority.</u>

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44 (f) All state agencies shall cooperate with the task force by providing requested

- 45 <u>information to assist the task force in its review and monitoring of broadband network</u>
- 46 projects as provided for in this Code section.
- 47 (g) The members of the task force shall be reimbursed for their actual travel expenses
- 48 <u>necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties and, for each day actually spent in</u>
- 49 the performance of their duties, shall receive the same per diem as do members of the
- General Assembly. Such allowance and reimbursement shall be paid in lieu of any other
- 51 per diem, allowance, or remuneration and shall be paid from funds appropriated to the
- 52 Georgia Technology Authority.
- 53 (h) The Georgia Technology Authority shall promulgate any policies necessary to
- 54 <u>effectuate the provisions of this Code section.</u>
- 55 (i) This Code section shall stand repealed on January 1, 2030."

56 SECTION 2.

57 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
