A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 elementary and secondary education, so as to provide for mandatory pre-kindergarten and
- 3 kindergarten for all children prior to entering into first grade; to lower the age of compulsory
- 4 school attendance from six years old to four years old; to provide for related matters; to
- 5 provide for contingent effectiveness; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elementary and
- 9 secondary education, is amended in Code Section 20-2-150, relating to eligibility for
- 10 enrollment for educational programs, by revising subsection (c) as follows:
- 11 "(c) All children enrolled for 20 school days or more in the public schools of this state
- prior to their seventh fifth birthday shall become subject to all of the provisions of this
- article, the provisions of Code Sections 20-2-690 through 20-2-701, and the rules and
- regulations of the State Board of Education relating to compulsory school attendance even
- though they have not attained seven five years of age."

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16 SECTION 2.

Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 20-2-151, relating to general and career education programs, by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (b) as follows:

"(1)(A) All local school systems may shall offer a full-day kindergarten program. For purposes of this subsection, the term 'full-day kindergarten program' means a student is provided classroom instruction for a minimum of four and one-half hours daily for a 180 day school year, or the equivalent thereof as determined in accordance with State Board of Education guidelines.

(B) It is the policy of this state that <u>all children shall attend Georgia's Pre-K Program</u> within the meaning of Article 1 of Chapter 1A of this title or a home school program within the meaning of Code Section 20-2-690 for one school year prior to enrolling in a full-day kindergarten program; that all children shall attend a full-day kindergarten program for one school year prior to enrolling in first grade; and that the purposes of Georgia's Pre-K Program and the kindergarten program programs shall be to provide all children with an equal opportunity to become prepared for a successful first grade experience and to acquire the foundation for academic progress throughout the students' educational careers. To be eligible for enrollment in a state supported Georgia's Pre-K Program, a child must attain the age of four by September 1; and to be eligible for enrollment in a state supported kindergarten program, a child must attain the age of five by September 1, except as otherwise provided by subsection (b) of Code Section

Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 20-2-690.1, relating to mandatory education for children between the ages of six and 16, by revising subsection (a) as follows:

"(a) Mandatory attendance in <u>Georgia's Pre-K Program within the meaning of Article 1 of</u> Chapter 1A of this title or a home school program as provided for in this subpart shall be 23 LC 49 1139

required for children who attain the age of four by September 1. Mandatory attendance in
a public school, private school, or home school program shall be required for children
between their sixth fifth and sixteenth birthdays, except that any child who attains the age
of five while enrolled in Georgia's Pre-K Program shall not be required to attend a public
school, private school, or home school program until the following school year. Such
mandatory attendance shall not be required where the child has successfully completed all
requirements for a high school diploma."

49 **SECTION 4.**

- 50 This Act shall become effective only upon the effective date of a specific appropriation of
- 51 funds for purposes of this Act, as expressed in a line item making specific reference to such
- 52 Act in a General Appropriations Act enacted by the General Assembly.

SECTION 5.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
