## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the "Quality Basic Education Act," so as to require that any course of study in sex
- 3 education and HIV/AIDS prevention instruction is medically accurate; to provide for a
- 4 definition; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 8 "Quality Basic Education Act," is amended by revising Code Section 20-2-143, relating to
- 9 sex education and AIDS prevention instruction, implementation, and student exemption, as
- 10 follows:
- 11 "20-2-143.
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'medically accurate' means complete information
- that is verified or supported by the weight of research conducted in compliance with
- 14 <u>accepted scientific methods; recognized as medically accurate and objective by leading</u>
- professional organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field, such as the
- 16 federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the American College of Obstetricians

and Gynecologists, the American Public Health Association, the American Academy of

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18 Pediatrics, the American Medical Association, and the National Association of School 19 Nurses; and published in peer reviewed journals where appropriate. 20 (b) Each local board of education shall prescribe a medically accurate course of study in 21 sex education, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), and AIDS acquired immune 22 deficiency syndrome (AIDS) prevention instruction for such grades and grade levels in the 23 public school system as shall be determined by the State Board of Education. Such course 24 of study shall implement either the minimum course of study provided for in subsection 25 (b)(c) of this Code section or its equivalent, as approved by the State Board of Education. 26 Each local board of education shall be authorized to supplement and develop the exact 27 approach of content areas of such minimum course of study with such specific medically accurate curriculum standards as it may deem appropriate. Such standards shall include 28 29 instruction relating to the handling of peer pressure, the promotion of high self-esteem, 30 local community values, the legal consequences of parenthood, and abstinence from sexual 31 activity as an effective method of prevention of pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, 32 and acquired immune deficiency syndrome HIV/AIDS. 33 (b)(c) The State Board of Education shall prescribe a medically accurate minimum course 34 of study in sex education and HIV/AIDS prevention instruction which may be included as 35 a part of a course of study in comprehensive health education for such grades and grade 36 levels in the public school system as shall be determined by the state board and shall 37 establish standards for its administration. The course may include instruction concerning 38 human biology, conception, pregnancy, birth, sexually transmitted diseases, and acquired 39 immune deficiency syndrome HIV/AIDS. The course shall include instruction concerning 40 the legal consequences of parenthood, including, without being limited to, the legal 41 obligation of both parents to support a child and legal penalties or restrictions upon failure 42 to support a child, including, without being limited to, the possible suspension or 43 revocation of a parent's driver's license and occupational or professional licenses. The

44 course shall also include annual age-appropriate sexual abuse and assault awareness and 45 prevention education in kindergarten through grade 9 nine. A manual setting out the details 46 of such course of study shall be prepared by or approved by the State School 47 Superintendent in cooperation with the Department of Public Health, the State Board of 48 Education, and such expert advisers as they may choose. 49 (c)(d) The minimum course of study to be prescribed by the State Board of Education 50 pursuant to subsection (b)(c) of this Code section shall be ready for implementation not 51 later than July 1, 1988 January 1, 2022. Each local board shall implement either such 52 minimum course of study or its equivalent not later than July 1, <del>1989</del> 2022. Any local 53 board of education which fails to comply with this subsection shall not be eligible to 54 receive any state funding under this article until such minimum course of study or its 55 equivalent has been implemented. 56 (d)(e) Any parent or legal guardian of a child to whom the course of study set forth in this 57 Code section is to be taught shall have the right to elect, in writing, that such child not 58 receive such course of study."

59 **SECTION 2.** 

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60 Said article is further amended in Code Section 20-2-201, relating to specific course requirements, in-service or continuing education, and online offerings, by revising subsection (b) as follows: 62

"(b) Each local unit of administration shall be required to provide all professional personnel certificated by the Professional Standards Commission 12 clock hours of in-service or continuing education in each calendar year, or meet requirements of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Such in-service programs shall be developed by the local unit of administration in conjunction with such agencies as regional educational service agencies, colleges and universities, and other appropriate organizations. These programs shall be designed to address identified needs determined by appropriate

personnel evaluation instruments. These programs shall also focus on improving the skills of certificated personnel that directly relate to improving student achievement, as reflected in the revised certification renewal rules established by the Professional Standards Commission pursuant to paragraph (4.1) of subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-200 regarding the impact of professional learning on student achievement. These programs shall also include in-service training programs on sexual abuse and assault awareness and prevention for professional personnel who will be providing instruction in annual age-appropriate sexual abuse and assault awareness and prevention education in kindergarten through grade nine pursuant to subsection (b)(c) of Code Section 20-2-143. Records of attendance shall be maintained by local units of administration and shall be monitored by appropriate Department of Education staff."

SECTION 3.

82 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
