## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Subpart 2 of Part 1 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of 2 Georgia Annotated, relating to compulsory attendance for students in elementary and 3 secondary education, so as to provide that student performers shall not be counted absent 4 from school due to performing in certain productions, subject to certain conditions; to 5 provide that the instruction and related services provided by a studio teacher to a student performer are aligned with the curriculum and content standards being delivered at the 6 7 student performer's school under certain circumstances; to provide for performance 8 certification forms and certification; to authorize the Department of Labor, in consultation 9 with the Department of Education, to develop such certification forms and promulgate rules 10 and regulations; to provide for authorizations by parents or guardians relating to the 11 education records of student performers; to provide for definitions; to provide a short title; 12 to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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## **SECTION 1.**

15 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Education on Set Act."

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16	SECTION 2.
17	Subpart 2 of Part 1 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
18	Annotated, relating to compulsory attendance for students in elementary and secondary
19	education, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
20	" <u>20-2-692.4.</u>
21	(a) As used in this Code section, the term:
22	(1) 'Child labor coordinator' means the person who is designated by the employing unit
23	as responsible for the coordination and safety of the student performer, including, but not
24	limited to, ensuring that the student performer is provided instruction and related services
25	by a studio teacher.
26	(2) 'Employing unit' means the person, agency, association, company, corporation,
27	group, or other organization using the services of a student performer.
28	(3) 'Performance' or 'performing' means participation in a production that is available to
29	the public, will be made available to the public, or is intended to be made available to the
30	<u>public.</u>
31	(4) 'Production' means a work that is being presented, will be presented, or is intended
32	to be presented by way of, but not limited to, the following: stage, screen, television,
33	internet, digital recording, video tape, audio tape, still photographic or phonographic
34	recording of any kind, open air, or runway modeling. A production shall include an
35	exhibition, as defined by the Department of Labor, but shall not include any participation
36	or performance related to a production or exhibition produced exclusively by a public
37	school, private school, or religious organization if such public school, private school, or
38	religious organization has not been issued a current employing unit certification by the
39	Department of Labor.
40	(5) 'Student performer' means a person under 18 years of age who is enrolled in a public
41	pre-kindergarten program or elementary or secondary school located in this state, who
42	has been issued a current minor's certification by the Department of Labor or current

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43	written consent by the Commissioner of Labor as provided in Code Section 39-2-18, and
44	who is performing in a production. Such term shall also mean a person over the age of
45	18 who is currently enrolled in a public secondary school located in this state and who
46	is performing in a production.
47	(6) 'Studio teacher' means a person who is certified as a studio teacher by the Department
48	of Labor, who holds a valid five-year induction or professional certificate issued by the
49	Georgia Professional Standards Commission, or who meets the requirements of rules or
50	regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education for providing instruction and
51	related services to student performers.
52	(b) A student performer who is performing during all or part of one or more school days
53	shall be credited as present by the school and shall not be counted as absent, either excused
54	or unexcused, for all or part of any day missed from school due to such performance that
55	is included on a performance certification completed by the student performer's parent or
56	guardian and the child labor coordinator or studio teacher assigned to the student performer
57	using a performance certification form promulgated by the Department of Labor for this
58	purpose. Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of subsection (c) of this Code section,
59	such performance certification shall clearly describe the curriculum and content standards
60	that were included in the instruction and related services provided to the student performer
61	by the studio teacher. Such performance certification shall be submitted to an official of
62	the student performer's school upon such student performer's return to school after the
63	performance which is the subject of the performance certification. A single performance
64	certification may be provided for a performance that continues for consecutive school days
65	on a single production.
66	(c)(1) Parents or guardians, studio teachers, child labor coordinators, and employing
67	units are each responsible for ensuring that the instruction and related services provided
68	to a student performer by a studio teacher are appropriate based on consideration of such

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69	student performer's age, grade level, and competency in reading, writing, and
70	mathematics aligned with the content standards adopted by the State Board of Education.
71	(2) Whenever a student performer is engaged in a performance for three consecutive
72	school days or longer, regardless of how long the production was originally intended to
73	be, employing units and child labor coordinators shall be responsible for ensuring that the
74	instruction and related services provided to a student performer by a studio teacher
75	include appropriate curriculum and content standards that are aligned with the curriculum
76	and content standards being delivered at the student performer's school regardless of such
77	student performer's age, and the studio teacher shall be responsible for coordinating with
78	the student performer's school teachers to ensure appropriate instructional materials and
79	resources, including, but not limited to, lessons, assignments, and assessments that are
80	aligned with the school's curriculum and content standards, are being used with the
81	student performer.
82	(3) For a student performer to be credited as present as provided in subsection (b) of this
83	Code section, a parent or guardian shall provide appropriate authorization for the student
84	performer's studio teachers and school personnel to communicate regarding the student
85	performer, including, but not limited to, communications involving the student
86	performer's education records as defined in the federal Family Educational Rights and
87	Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. Section 1232g.
88	(d) Upon consultation with the Department of Education, the Department of Labor shall
89	promulgate a performance certification form and such policies and procedures necessary

- 90 to ensure compliance with this Code section."
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## **SECTION 3.**

92 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
