## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 7 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to regulation of hospitals and related institutions, so as to require nursing homes to
- 3 annually offer influenza vaccinations to its health care workers and other employees; to
- 4 provide for limited liability; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 5 other purposes.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 1 of Chapter 7 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 regulation of hospitals and related institutions, is amended by adding a new Code section to
- 10 read as follows:

- 12 (a) Each nursing home shall annually offer on site to its health care workers and other
- employees who have direct contact with patients, at no cost, vaccinations for the influenza
- virus in accordance with the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and
- 15 <u>Prevention, subject to availability of the vaccine.</u> Each nursing home shall keep on record
- 16 <u>a signed statement from each such health care worker and employee stating that he or she</u>
- 17 <u>has been offered vaccination against the influenza virus and has either accepted or declined</u>
- 18 <u>such vaccination</u>. A nursing home may offer to its health care workers and other
- 19 employees who have direct contact with patients any other vaccination required or
- 21 Control and Prevention, which may be offered or administered pursuant to standing orders

recommended by, and in accordance with the recommendations of, the Centers for Disease

- 22 approved by the nursing home's medical staff to ensure the safety of employees, patients,
- visitors, and contractors.
- 24 (b) A nursing home or health care provider acting in good faith and in accordance with
- 25 generally accepted health care standards applicable to such nursing home or health care

26 provider shall not be subject to administrative, civil, or criminal liability or to discipline for

27 <u>unprofessional conduct for complying with the requirements of this Code section."</u>

29 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
