## House Bill 21

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to offenses against public order, so as to revise the offense of unlawful conduct
- 3 during 9-1-1 call to include bias motivations in calling or otherwise contacting 9-1-1; to
- 4 provide for a criminal penalty; to amend Chapter 1 of Title 51 of the Official Code of
- 5 Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions regarding torts, so as to provide for a cause
- 6 of action against persons who knowingly cause a peace officer to arrive at a location, owing
- 7 to false reporting or bias purposes; to provide for definitions; to provide for related matters;
- 8 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Article 2 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 12 offenses against public order, is amended by revising subsections (b) and (c) of Code
- 13 Section 16-11-39.2, relating to unlawful conduct during 9-1-1 call, as follows:
- 14 "(b) A person commits the offense of unlawful conduct during a 9-1-1 telephone call if he
- or she:

16 (1) Without provocation, uses obscene, vulgar, or profane language with the intent to

- intimidate or harass a 9-1-1 communications officer;
- 18 (2) Calls or otherwise contacts 9-1-1, whether or not conversation ensues, for the purpose
- of annoying, harassing, or molesting a 9-1-1 communications officer or for the purpose
- of interfering with or disrupting emergency telephone service;
- 21 (3) Calls or otherwise contacts 9-1-1 and fails to hang up or disengage the connection for
- the intended purpose of interfering with or disrupting emergency service;
- 23 (4) Calls or otherwise contacts 9-1-1 with the intention to harass a communications
- 24 officer; or
- 25 (5) Calls or otherwise contacts 9-1-1 and makes a false report; or
- 26 (6) Calls or otherwise contacts 9-1-1:
- 27 (A) And makes a false report for a purpose motivated by an individual's or group of
- 28 <u>individuals' race, color, national origin, ethnicity, religion, gender, disability, or sexual</u>
- 29 <u>orientation; or</u>
- 30 (B) With the purpose to intimidate an individual or group of individuals because of
- 31 such individual's or group of individuals' race, color, national origin, ethnicity, religion,
- 32 gender, disability, or sexual orientation.
- 33 (c) Any person who violates subsection (b) of this Code section shall be guilty of a
- misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than
- \$500.00 or 12 months in jail, or both; provided, however, that any person who violates
- paragraph (6) of subsection (b) shall be punished only by a fine of not more than
- 37 \$1,000.00."
- 38 SECTION 2.
- 39 Chapter 1 of Title 51 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- 40 provisions regarding torts, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

- 41 "51-1-56.
- 42 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 43 (1) 'False report' means the fabrication of an incident or crime or the fabrication of
- 44 <u>material information relating to an incident or crime of which the person making the</u>
- 45 report knows to be false at the time of making the report.
- 46 (2) 'Peace officer' means any person who, by virtue of his or her office or public
- employment, is vested by law with a duty to maintain public order or to make arrests for
- offenses, whether that duty is limited to specific offenses or extends to all crimes.
- 49 (b) A person shall have a right of action against another for knowingly causing a peace
- officer to arrive at a location to contact such person as a result of a false report or with the
- intent to infringe upon such person's rights under the Constitution of this state or of the
- 52 <u>Constitution of the United States, including, but not limited to, causing such peace officer</u>
- 53 to arrive because of such person's race, color, national origin, ethnicity, religion, gender,
- 54 <u>disability</u>, or sexual orientation."

SECTION 3.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
