A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 7 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to medical assistance generally, so as to expand the use of telehealth options in the
- 3 Medicaid program; to extend the temporary use of telehealth options during the pandemic
- 4 emergency to a permanent status; to provide for certification and training of providers of
- 5 medical assistance via telehealth options; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- 6 laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Article 7 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- medical assistance generally, is amended in Code Section 49-4-142, relating to a state plan
- of medical assistance adopted, administered, and modified by the Department of Community
- Health, by adding a new subsection to read as follows:
- 13 "(e) The department shall take all reasonable and necessary steps to obtain permanent
- 14 <u>federal approval and to permanently implement the state's authorization through an</u>
- 15 Appendix K submission for a temporary waiver modification due to the COVID-19
- pandemic emergency to utilize telehealth options in accordance with federal Health

- 20 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 21 "49-4-143.1.
- 22 The department shall authorize and implement a system of certification, recertification, and
- 23 training of providers of medical assistance via telehealth options where appropriate, in lieu
- 24 <u>of in-person observation models."</u>
- 25 SECTION 3.
- 26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
