A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 1 of Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions applicable to the General Assembly, so as to provide for a pilot program to evaluate whether health notes to assess the potential health impact by proposed legislation should be required by the General Assembly; to provide for a definition; to provide for recommendations; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide for other related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

9 Chapter 1 of Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
10 provisions applicable to the General Assembly, is amended by adding a new Code section
11 to read as follows:

12 ″<u>28-1-18.</u>

13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'health note' means a written analysis of

14 proposed legislation to determine potential health impacts on individuals' health, health

15 <u>care providers, the health care system, and public health programs and initiatives.</u>

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16	(b) The Office of Planning and Budget in conjunction with the Department of Community
17	Health shall establish a pilot program to evaluate whether health notes on proposed
18	legislation will provide benefit to the General Assembly and the public. The pilot program
19	shall evaluate the value and utility of health notes, the cost to produce such health notes,
20	and the timeliness of producing health notes. In addition, the pilot program should evaluate
21	which public, private, academic, nonprofit, policy, or other organizations or entities should
22	be consulted or identified to assist in producing health notes. The pilot program shall be
23	conducted leading up to and during the 2022 regular session of the General Assembly.
24	(c) No later than December 1, 2022, the Office of Planning and Budget and the
25	Department of Community Health shall jointly make recommendations to the General
26	Assembly as to whether health notes should be required, optional, or not utilized, and if
27	required or optional, which organizations or entities should be participants.
28	(d) This Code section shall stand repealed by operation of law on December 31, 2022."

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SECTION 2.

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
