## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 2 emergency medical services, so as to provide that first responders of municipal fire
- 3 departments may engage in the emergency medical transportation of patients; to revise
- 4 findings and a declaration of policy concerning first responders in this state; to revise and
- 5 provide for definitions; to provide that first responders of a fire department of a municipality
- 6 shall be granted licenses for emergency medical transportation under certain circumstances;
- 7 to revise the Emergency Medical Systems Communications Program (EMSC Program); to
- 8 provide for rules and regulations; to provide for licensing; to provide for related matters; to
- 9 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

11 SECTION 1.

- 12 Chapter 11 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to emergency
- medical services, is amended in Code Section 31-11-1, relating to findings and declaration
- of policy, by revising paragraph (6) of subsection (a) as follows:
- 15 "(6) Any first responder falls under the department's rules and regulations governing
- ambulances and can transport only in life-threatening situations or by orders of a licensed
- 17 physician or when a licensed ambulance cannot respond may engage in the emergency
- medical transportation of patients as provided for in this chapter."

19 SECTION 2.

- 20 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 31-11-2, relating to definitions, by revising
- 21 paragraphs (1.2) and (10) and by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:
- 22 "(1.2) 'Ambulance' means a motor vehicle that is specially constructed and equipped or
- an air ambulance and is intended to be used for the emergency transportation of patients,
- 24 including emergency medical service motor vehicles of fire departments, dual purpose

police patrol cars and funeral coaches, or hearses which otherwise comply with the

- 26 provisions of this chapter."
- 27 "(9.1) 'Fire department' shall have the same meaning as provided for in Code Section
- 28 <u>25-3-21.</u>
- 29 (10) 'First responder' means any person or agency who that provides on-site care until:
- 30 (A) Until the arrival of a duly licensed ambulance service; or
- 31 (B) Upon the emergency medical transportation of patients by such person or agency
- 32 <u>acting as an ambulance service.</u>"
- 33 SECTION 3.
- 34 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 35 <u>"31-11-2.1.</u>
- 36 (a) The department shall grant a license for emergency medical transportation to a first
- 37 <u>responder if such first responder:</u>
- 38 (1) Is of a fire department of a municipality; and
- 39 (2) Meets the same applicable training and standards criteria established by the
- 40 <u>department for the provision of ambulance services.</u>
- 41 (b) When a first responder has obtained a license for emergency medical transportation as
- 42 provided for under subsection (a) of this Code section, such first responder shall administer
- 43 the emergency medical services system for the geographical area covering its jurisdiction
- and may contract with licensed ambulance providers to supplement such first responder's
- 45 <u>coverage of such geographical area.</u>
- 46 (c) A first responder that obtains a license for emergency medical transportation shall be
- 47 <u>authorized to bill patients and to recover fees, expenses, and administrative costs associated</u>
- with such emergency medical transportation conducted by the first responder."
- 49 SECTION 4.
- 50 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 31-11-3, relating to recommendations by
- 51 local coordinating entity as to administration of EMSC Program and hearing and appeal, by
- 52 revising subsection (a) as follows:
- 53 "(a) The Board of Public Health shall have the authority on behalf of the state to designate
- and contract with a public or nonprofit local entity to coordinate and administer the EMSC
- Program for each health district, or the parts of each health district, designated by the
- Department of Public Health that is not within the geographical area of a first responder
- 57 <u>having a license for emergency medical transportation as provided for in Code Section</u>
- 58 <u>31-11-2.1</u>. The local coordinating entity thus designated shall be responsible for
- recommending to the board or its designee the manner in which the EMSC Program is to

be conducted. In making its recommendations, the local coordinating entity shall give

- priority to making the EMSC Program function as efficiently and economically as possible.
- Each licensed ambulance provider in the health district shall have the opportunity to
- participate in the EMSC Program."

SECTION 5.

- 65 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 31-11-5, relating to rules and regulations,
- 66 by revising subsection (a) as follows:
- 67 "(a) The department is authorized to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for the
- protection of the public health:
- 69 (1) Prescribing reasonable health, sanitation, and safety standards for transporting
- patients in ambulances;
- 71 (2) Prescribing reasonable conditions under which ambulance attendants or first
- 72 <u>responders</u> are required;
- 73 (3) Establishing criteria for the training of ambulance attendants <u>and first responders that</u>
- 74 <u>engage in the emergency medical transportation of patients</u>; and
- 75 (4) Establishing that The emergency medical technician course is courses are to be
- offered at area hospitals and area technical vocational schools in conjunction with their
- emergency patient care and personnel training programs."

## 78 SECTION 6.

- 79 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 31-11-6, relating to records, as
- 80 follows:
- 81 "31-11-6.
- 82 (a) Records of each ambulance trip shall be made by the ambulance service in a manner
- and on such forms as may be prescribed by the department through regulations. Such
- records shall be available for inspection by the department at any time, and a summary of
- ambulance service activities shall be prepared on specific cases and furnished to the
- department upon request.
- 87 (b) Records of each first responder trip wherein the emergency medical transportation of
- a patient has occurred shall be made by the person or agency that provides on-site care in
- a manner and on such forms as may be prescribed by the department through regulations.
- 90 Such records shall be available for inspection by the department at any time, and a
- 91 <u>summary of such emergency medical transportation activities shall be prepared in specific</u>
- 92 cases and furnished to the department upon request."

93	SECTION 7.					
94	Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:					
95	" <u>31-11-13.</u>					
96	No first responder shall engage in the emergency medical transportation of patients without					
97	having a valid license issued by the license officer for such purpose. Such license shall					
98	conform to the requirements and standards provided for an ambulance service pursuant to					
99	this chapter."					
100	SECTION 8.					
101	Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 31-11-53.1, relating to automated external					
102	defibrillator program, establishment, regulations, and liability, by revising paragraph (3) of					
103	subsection (a) as follows:					
104	"(3) 'First responder' means any person or agency who that provides on-site care until:					
105	(A) Until the arrival of a duly licensed ambulance service; or					
106	(B) Upon the emergency medical transportation of patients by such person or agency					
107	acting as an ambulance service.					
108	This shall include, but not be limited to, persons who or agencies that routinely respond					
109	to calls for assistance through an affiliation with law enforcement agencies, fire					
110	suppression agencies, rescue agencies, and others."
