A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions regarding health, so as to prohibit feminine hygiene products containing
- 3 restricted substances from being distributed, sold, or offered for sale in this state; to provide
- 4 for definitions; to provide for a short title; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- 5 laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Menstrual Product Protection Act."
- 9 SECTION 2.
- 10 Chapter 1 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- provisions regarding health, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- *"*31-1-25.
- 13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:

14 (1) 'Feminine hygiene products' means tampons, pads, liners, cups, sponges, douches, wipes, sprays, and similar products used in conjunction with respect to menstruation or 15 16 other genital-tract secretions. (2) 'Restricted substance' means <u>lead</u>; mercury and related compounds; formaldehyde; 17 triclosan; toluene; talc; perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances; dibutyl phthalate; 18 di(2)exylhexyl phthalate; and isobutyl-, isopropyl-, butyl-, and propylparaben. 19 (b) On and after July 1, 2024, no feminine hygiene products containing a restricted 20 21 substance or using a restricted substance as a fragrance, colorant, dve, preservative, or other intentionally added ingredient shall be distributed, sold, or offered for sale in this state, 22 23 whether at retail or wholesale, for personal, professional, or commercial use, or distributed for promotional purposes." 24

25 SECTION 3.

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
