A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Title 2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to agriculture, so as to
establish the Office of Equity in Agriculture; to provide definitions; to provide for purpose;
to provide for training; to establish and provide requirements for the Georgia Farmers
Council; to provide for purpose; to provide for related matters; to provide for a short title; to
repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.
8 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Georgia Racial Equity in Agriculture Act."

9 SECTION 2.

10 Title 2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to agriculture, is amended by

11 adding a new chapter to read as follows:

12	<u>CHAPTER 24</u>
13	"2-24-1.
13	As used in this chapter, the term:
15	(1) 'Agricultural easement' means a nonpossessory interest of a holder in real property
15	imposing limitations on the use of the property strictly to agricultural purposes.
17	(2) 'Eligible person' means a natural person who is a resident of this state, is at least 21
18	years of age, has previously identified as Black or African American, and has at least one
19	parent of African ancestry.
20	(3) 'Qualified entity' means an organization which has a fiscal sponsor who is exempt
21	from taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986; which
22	has a minimum of three years of experience providing agricultural services, business
23	assistance, legal assistance, or advocacy services to socially disadvantaged farmers; and
24	in which at least one-third of the members of the organization's board of directors are
25	members of a socially disadvantaged group.
26	(4) 'Socially disadvantaged farmer' means a farmer who is a member of a socially
27	disadvantaged group.
28	(5) 'Socially disadvantaged group' means a group of people whose members have been
29	subject to racial or ethnic prejudice because of their identity as a member of a group
30	without regard to their individual qualities.
31	(6) 'Training' means a program of training approved by the Commissioner that provides
32	an eligible person with the basic skills to operate a farm profitably with a primary focus
33	on regenerating the soil, ecosystem, and local community; provides a course of study that
34	is equivalent to no less than 30 academic credit hours of study, which may be provided
35	as direct in-field instruction; focuses on low capital-intensive techniques and
36	technologies; and studies local and regional food systems and the market opportunities
37	those systems present.

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38	<u>2-24-2.</u>
39	(a) There is created the Office of Equity in Agriculture within the department to support
40	current members of socially disadvantaged groups and to encourage the growth of
41	members of socially disadvantaged groups into the field of agriculture. The Office of
42	Equity in Agriculture shall administer the provisions of this chapter.
43	(b) The purpose of the Office of Equity in Agriculture is to:
44	(1) Implement measures to address discrimination and promote equity in the distribution
45	of government programs, loans, and other assistance to members of socially
46	disadvantaged groups in this state, including, but not limited to, investigating and
47	redressing discrimination complaints from members of socially disadvantaged groups and
48	implementing training and education programs to promote industry competency;
49	(2) Promote the success of members of socially disadvantaged groups with training,
50	mentorship, and education programs, including, but not limited to, technical assistance,
51	marketing, and business development support;
52	(3) Encourage the development, promotion, and marketing of specialty crops and
53	nontraditional farming techniques in this state;
54	(4) Develop partnerships with businesses and organizations committed to supporting
55	disadvantaged farmers' livelihoods to increase access to markets, capital, and technology;
56	(5) Work with state agencies, local governments, and community based organizations
57	to develop partnerships and programs to promote the success of members of socially
58	disadvantaged groups;
59	(6) Develop financial assistance programs to provide aid to members of socially
60	disadvantaged groups are affected by natural disasters;
61	(7) Develop educational programming for use in schools, community centers, and other
62	public venues, to raise awareness about the importance of supporting members of socially
63	disadvantaged groups and their contributions to the agricultural industry and
64	communities; and

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65	(8) Maintain and make available statistical data regarding loan applications, programs,
66	assistance rendered, complaints lodged, and the outcomes resulting from such.

- 68 There is established the Georgia Farmers Council within the Office of Equity in
- 69 Agriculture. The purpose of the Farmers Council is to study and offer practicable solutions
- 70 to redress the root causes of discrimination and other barriers members of socially
- 71 <u>disadvantaged groups face.</u>"

73 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
