The House Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Security offers the following substitute to HB 316:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 3 of Chapter 7 of Title 52 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to abandoned vessels, so as to remove the requirement of notification to the Georgia Bureau of Investigation and the Georgia Crime Information Center; to eliminate the requirement to place information regarding abandoned vessels into the National Crime Information Center network; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

9 Article 3 of Chapter 7 of Title 52 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
10 abandoned vessels, is amended by revising subsections (e) and (h) through (l) of Code
11 Section 52-7-71, relating to the removal and storage of abandoned vessels, as follows:

12 "(e) If the person identified as the owner fails to redeem such vessel as described in 13 subsection (d) of this Code section, or if a vessel being repaired by a repair facility or being stored by an insurance company providing insurance to cover damages to the vessel 14 15 becomes abandoned, the person removing or storing such vessel shall, within seven 16 calendar days of the day such vessel became an abandoned vessel, give notice in writing, 17 by sworn statement, to the Department of Natural Resources and the Georgia Bureau of 18 Investigation, stating the vessel certificate of number, the hull identification number, the 19 fact that such vessel is an abandoned vessel, the model, year, and make of the vessel, if 20 known or if readily ascertainable, the date the vessel became an abandoned vessel, the date 21 the vessel was removed, and the present location of such vessel and requesting the name 22 and address of all owners, lessors, lessees, security interest holders, and lienholders of such 23 vessel. If a person removing or storing the vessel has knowledge of facts which reasonably 24 indicate that the vessel is registered or titled in a certain other state, such person shall check 25 the vessel records of that other state in the attempt to ascertain the identity of the owner of 26 the vessel."

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27 ["](h) Information forwarded to the Georgia Bureau of Investigation as required by this Code 28 section shall be placed by the bureau on the National Crime Information Center Network. 29 (i)(h) Any person storing a vessel under the provisions of this Code section shall notify the 30 Department of Natural Resources and the Georgia Bureau of Investigation if the vessel is recovered, is claimed by the owner, is determined to be stolen, or is for any reason no 31 32 longer an abandoned vessel. Such notice shall be provided within seven calendar days of 33 such event. (i) If vessel information on the abandoned vessel is not in the files of the Department 34

35 of Natural Resources, the department may require such other information or confirmation

- 36 as it determines is necessary or appropriate to determine the identity of the vessel.
- 37 (k)(j) Any person who does not provide the notice and information required by this Code
 38 section shall not be entitled to any storage fees.

(1)(k) Any person who knowingly provides false or misleading information when providing any notice or information as required by this Code section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished as for a misdemeanor."

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SECTION 2.

43 Said article is further amended by revising subsection (d) of Code Section 52-7-72, relating
44 to the authority of peace officers to remove unattended vessels, as follows:

45 "(d)(1) Any peace officer who finds a vessel under such conditions as described in
46 subsection (a) or (b) of this Code section shall within 72 hours from the time of such
47 finding:

(A) Notify the Department of Natural Resources and the Georgia Crime Information
 Center of the description of the vessel, whether the vessel has been removed or not,

50 and, if removed, the location to which such vessel has been removed; and

(B) If available on the Georgia Crime Information Center <u>Network network</u>, determine
the name and address of the last known registered owner of such vessel.

53 If vessel information is not in the files of the Department of Natural Resources, the 54 department may require such other information or confirmation as it determines is 55 necessary or appropriate to determine the identity of the vessel.

- (2) If any such vessel is determined to be a stolen vessel, the local law enforcement
 officer or agency shall notify the Georgia Crime Information Center and the owner, if
 known, of the location of such vessel within 72 hours after receiving notice that such
 vessel is a stolen vessel.
- (3) If the vessel is removed and the name and address of the last known registered owner
 of the vessel is obtained from the Georgia Crime Information Center, the peace officer
 who causes the vessel to be removed shall, within three calendar days of removal, make

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available to the person removing such vessel the name and address of the last known
registered owner of such vessel. If such information is not available, the peace officer
shall, within three calendar days of removal, notify the person removing or storing such
vessel of such fact."

67 **SECTION 3.** Said article is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 52-7-72.1, relating 68 to penalty for failing to remove unattended vessel, as follows: 69 70 "(a)(1) If any vessel for which the Department of Natural Resources and the Georgia 71 Crime Information Center have has received notice pursuant to subsection (d) of Code 72 Section 52-7-72 has not been removed and is determined not to be a stolen vessel, the 73 commissioner may proceed to take action against the owner as provided by this Code 74 section. 75 (2) If any vessel for which the Department of Natural Resources and the Georgia Crime 76 Information Center have has received notice pursuant to subsection (d) of Code Section 77 52-7-72 has been removed, the provisions of this Code section shall not apply and the 78 provisions of Code Section 52-7-71 shall apply instead." 79 **SECTION 4.** Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 52-7-76, relating to certificate of 80 81 title, as follows:

82 "52-7-76.

The purchaser at a sale as authorized in this article shall receive a certified copy of the court order authorizing such sale. Any such purchaser may obtain a certificate of title <u>number</u> to such vessel by filing the required application, paying the required fees, and filing a certified copy of the order of the court with the Department of Natural Resources. The Department of Natural Resources shall then issue a certificate of title, which shall be free and clear of all liens and encumbrances."

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SECTION 5.

90 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
