A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 2 of Chapter 9 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the jurisdiction, power, and duties of probate courts, and Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 53 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions concerning wills, trusts, and administration of estates, respectively, so as to provide that certain cases concerning the probate of wills may be removed from a probate court to a superior court; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

Article 2 of Chapter 9 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
jurisdiction, power, and duties of probate courts, is amended in Code Section 15-9-30,
relating to the subject matter jurisdiction, powers, and duties of probate courts, by revising
paragraph (1) of subsection (a) as follows:

14 "(1) The probate of wills, except as provided in Code Section 15-9-30.10;"

16	Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
17	″ <u>15-9-30.10.</u>
18	(a) Notwithstanding Code Sections 15-9-30 and 53-5-1 or any other provision of law to
19	the contrary, parties to any case concerning the probate of a will that is before a probate
20	court, that the probate court otherwise has exclusive jurisdiction over, and that is subject
21	to the appellate jurisdiction of the superior court may, upon the consent of all parties and
22	upon leave of both the probate court and the superior court, remove such case to the
23	superior court, which such case shall then be presented to, heard, and determined by the
24	superior court in the same manner as cases over which the superior court has original
25	jurisdiction.
26	(b) Removal of any case from a probate court to a superior court under subsection (a) of
27	this Code section shall not waive, hinder, or impair any party's right to trial by jury as
28	provided by law."
29	SECTION 3.
30	Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 53 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
31	general provisions concerning wills, trusts, and administration of estates, is amended in Code
32	Section 53-5-1, relating to the jurisdiction over the probate of wills, by revising subsection
33	(a) as follows:
34	"(a) Except as provided in Code Section 15-9-30.10, The the probate court shall have
35	exclusive jurisdiction over the probate of wills."

37	All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
