A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 12 of Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to name
- 2 changes, so as to provide a process for individuals to change their surname to their birth
- 3 certificate surname; to provide for applications; to provide for certificates of name change;
- 4 to provide for transmittal of such certificates to the Department of Public Health; to provide
- 5 that fraudulently depriving another of rights is not authorized; to amend Chapter 10 of Title
- 6 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to vital records, so as to provide for
- 7 records of certificates of name change; to provide for regulations; to provide for maintenance
- 8 of originals of applications and certificates; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 9 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 12 Chapter 12 of Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to name changes,
- is amended in Code Section 19-12-1, relating to petition for name change, request by victim
- of family violence or human trafficking, notice of filing, and consent of minor's parents or
- 15 guardian, by revising subsection (b) as follows:

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"(b) Any Except as otherwise provided in Code Section 19-12-5, any individual desirous of changing his or her name or the name of his or her child may present a petition to the superior court of the county of his or her residence. Such petition shall set forth fully and particularly the reasons why the name change is being requested. Such petition shall be verified by the petitioner."

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21 **SECTION 2.** 22 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows: 23 "19-12-5. 24 (a) An individual may make written application to the judge of the probate court of the county in which he or she resides to change his or her surname to his or her surname as 25 shown on his or her birth certificate. The application shall, at a minimum, include the 26 27 current full name, surname as shown on his or her birth certificate, date of birth, and social 28 security number of the applicant and shall otherwise comply with any regulations of the 29 Department of Public Health. The application shall be accompanied by a certified copy of 30 the individual's birth certificate. The application shall be recorded by the judge of the 31 probate court in a book kept by such judge for that purpose and may be used as evidence 32 in any court of law under the rules of evidence made and provided in similar cases. 33 (b) Within 30 days of receipt of an application under subsection (a) of this Code section, 34 the judge of the probate court shall issue to the applicant five certified copies of a 35 certificate of name change which shall be in substantially the following form: 36 This is to certify that the name of (full name prior to 37 application for change of name) has been changed to 38 (full name after application for change of name). 39 Given under the hand and seal of said court, this the day of 40

45	(c) Every probate court judge shall forward to the Department of Public Health on or
46	before the tenth day of each calendar month copies of all certificates of name change issued
47	by such probate court judge during the preceding calendar month. Such copies may be
48	transmitted in the form of paper or electronically.
49	(d) The judge of the probate court shall not charge a fee for applications for certificates of
50	name change.
51	(e) Nothing contained in this Code section shall authorize any person to change his or her
52	name with a view to deprive another fraudulently of any right under the law."
53	SECTION 3.
54	Chapter 10 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to vital records,
55	is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
56	" <u>31-10-22.1.</u>
57	(a) A record of each certificate of name change issued in this state pursuant to Code
58	Section 19-12-5 shall be filed with the department and shall be registered if it has been
59	completed and filed in accordance with this Code section.
60	(b) The application provided for in Code Section 19-12-5 shall be completed as prescribed
61	by regulations of the department.
62	(c) The judge of the probate court shall keep the original of the application and the
63	certificate of name change for the county records from which the judge of the probate court

66 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
