## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 1A of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to nonpublic postsecondary educational institutions, so as to specify the
- 3 initial application and renewal fees for degree-granting and nondegree-granting nonpublic
- 4 postsecondary educational institutions based on student enrollment; to provide for related
- 5 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 1A of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to nonpublic postsecondary educational institutions, is amended by revising Code
- 10 Section 20-3-250.11, relating to the collection of fees established by the Nonpublic
- 11 Postsecondary Education Commission, as follows:
- 12 "20-3-250.11.
- 13 (a) Fees shall be collected by the executive director in such amounts as shall be established
- by the commission as provided in this Code section.
- 15 (b) The initial application and renewal fee schedule for degree-granting and
- 16 <u>nondegree-granting nonpublic postsecondary educational institutions shall be based on</u>
- 17 <u>student enrollment of the institution as follows:</u>

18	<u>Enrollment</u>	Annual Fee
19	0 - 100 students	\$ 500.00
20	<u>101 - 500 students</u>	<u>1,000.00</u>
21	<u>501 - 1,000 students</u>	<u>2,000.00</u>
22	<u>1,001 - 5,000 students</u>	<u>3,000.00</u>
23	<u>5,001 - 10,000 students</u>	<u>4,000.00</u>
24	More than 10,000 students	<u>5,000.00</u>

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The commission may establish requirements for the purpose of confirming enrollment numbers of the institution. If an institution does not submit enrollment information to the

- 27 <u>commission, enrollment shall be assessed at the highest level.</u>
- 28 (c) The commission is authorized to establish the following fees and fee schedules:
- 29 (1) Separate initial application and renewal fee schedules for degree-granting and
- 30 nondegree-granting nonpublic postsecondary educational institutions based upon the
- 31 commission's relative cost of performing its duties and responsibilities with regard to
- 32 those categories of institutions and, within those categories, based upon actual or
- 33 projected gross tuition of those institutions;
- 34 (2)(1) Initial and renewal fees for agents' permits;
- 35 (3)(2) Special fees for the evaluation of postsecondary educational institutions;
- 36 (4)(3) Fees authorized pursuant to Code Section 20-3-250.27; and
- 37 (5)(4) Special fees to offset other identified administrative costs.
- 38 (d) All fees collected pursuant to this part, except fees collected pursuant to Code Section
- 39 20-3-250.27, shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the general fund, and
- 40 no fees collected under this part shall be subject to refund, except as provided in Code
- Section 20-3-250.27. Except as otherwise indicated in this part, the fees to be collected by
- 42 the commission under this part shall accompany an application for authorization to operate
- or an agent's permit.
- 44 (b)(e) The commission will pay all costs for evaluation committees that may be necessary
- 45 to implement this part."
